This letter will provide information responsive to certain issues identified by Staff at our February 8, 2000 meeting. More specifically, Staff inquired into our prior marketing of resale services in the Atlanta market. AT&T's Total Services Resale ("TSR") offering was briefly marketed in Atlanta beginning in 1997 as part of AT&T's market readiness testing in preparation for general availability of an AT&T offering throughout the State. The readiness testing was conducted in the Atlanta LATA only. Because of problems with BellSouth's Operation Support Systems and processes, including system deficiencies that resulted in lost and cancelled orders and ordering backlogs, AT&T's Georgia marketing efforts never advanced beyond the readiness testing phase. As a result, the total number of TSR customers acquired in the Atlanta LATA peaked at under 20,000.

AT&T's TSR plans were suspended indefinitely in October/November 1997. Although no new customers were acquired after that time, service continued to be provided to the then-existing base until those customers opted to cancel or terminate their service. The embedded base that remains today includes only a few thousand customers.
