

**PETITION FOR RULEMAKING**

1. Northern Radio of Michigan, Inc. ("Northern"), permittee of broadcast station WIAR(FM), Honor, Michigan, through counsel, hereby proposes modification of the FM Table of Allotments, 47 C.F.R. Section 73.202(b), to change the class of WIAR(FM) from class A to C3. The modification would increase the population served by WIAR(FM) from 35,699 to 79,839, an addition of 44,140 people.

**Engineering Showing**

2. As shown in the attached engineering exhibit (Exhibit A), the requested modification would require the following additional changes to the FM Table of Allotments:

■ WSRQ(FM), Bear Lake, Michigan, from Channel 261A to Channel 291A. The move of the third-adjacent channel 261A will be required to allow WIAR(FM)'s upgrade to class C3. The move will permit an increase in WSRQ(FM)'s signal strength from a maximum 3.0 kw to 6.0 kw. D&B Broadcasting, LLC, licensee of WSRQ(FM), supports this change. See Letter from David C. Schaberg, Vice President of D&B Broadcasting, LLC (Exhibit B). The proposed change will permit WSRQ(FM) to improve its population coverage from 15,468 to

23,222, an increase of 7,754 people.

- WKLA(FM), Ludington, Michigan, from Channel 292A to Channel 254A. The move can be accomplished at WKLA(FM)'s existing tower location.
- Channel 255A allocation at Walhalla, Michigan, moved to Remus, Michigan.

To make Channel 254A available at Ludington, Channel 255A at Walhalla, Michigan, must be removed. This allocation has had no activity since it was allocated and there is no filing window currently scheduled. Therefore, Northern proposes to reallocate Channel 255A to Remus, Michigan, as that community's first aural service.

3. The attached engineering study (Exhibit A) shows that the proposed modifications may be done in accordance with Commission rules and would benefit the public interest.

Accordingly, Northern requests that the Commission amend the FM Table of Allotments and the licenses and permits of the affected stations, licensees, and permittees as follows:

**Remus, Michigan**

4. In order to effect the requested modification of the FM Table of Allotments, the Commission must allocate Channel 255A to Remus. However, the Commission must first be satisfied that Remus has the social, economic, and cultural indicia to qualify as a community for allotment purposes. Remus easily meets these criteria. While it is unincorporated, it has a post office (49340), a business district, a school system, numerous churches, and community events

and organizations. Remus is the seat of Wheatland Township in southeastern Mecosta County. The offices of the Township Supervisor, Clerk, Treasurer, two Trustees, and six Library Board members are located in Remus. More than a third of the Township population of 1,365 people resides in Remus, which has a population of 480 within its boundaries.<sup>1</sup> Additionally, there are an estimated 953 people residing in the villages of Mecosta, Millbrook, and Blanchard, all within 10 miles of Remus.<sup>2</sup>

5. Social. Remus is a community for allotment purposes because it has an identifiable population grouping with businesses and community organizations that identify themselves with Remus. See Garrison, Kentucky, 6 FCC Rcd 1428 (1991); Harrietta, Michigan, 12 FCC Rcd 6058 (1997); and Keansville, Florida, 10 FCC Rcd 9831 (1995). The Chippewa Hills School District is centered in Remus, an additional indication that Remus is recognized as a community. The School District has five schools in Remus: Barryton Elementary School, Mecosta Elementary School, Weidman Elementary School, Remus Junior High School, and Chippewa Hills High School. The total student population is 2,515. See Exhibit C.

6. Additionally, Remus is recognized as a community on a web site directory of Michigan communities. The web site has information on Remus businesses, churches, organizations, recreation, and events, and includes a photograph of downtown Remus. See Exhibit D; <http://www.multimag.com/city/mi/remus/>.

7. Economic. Remus has a recognizable economic center. See Exhibit E. Downtown Remus sits at the intersection of state highways 20 and 66 and has 26 businesses on

its main street and seven additional businesses on surrounding side streets. These businesses include two banks, a lumberyard, drug store, general merchandise stores, doctor's offices, and gas stations, as well as two industrial businesses: U.S. Marble, Inc. and Bandit Industries, Inc. There are a total of 69 businesses listed in the telephone book with a Remus address. See Exhibit F.

8. Cultural. Remus is also recognized as a cultural center. There are seven places of worship in the community of Remus: Remus Church of God, Chippewa Hills Baptist Church, Wheatland Church of God, St. Michael's Catholic Church and School, Kingdom Hall of Jehovah's Witnesses, St. Paul Lutheran Church, and Chippewa Hills Assembly of God. There is also a Wesleyan Parsonage. See Exhibit F. Remus also has cultural events and organizations: The annual Traditional Arts Weekend is held on the Wheatland Festival Grounds in Remus on the last weekend in May; Remus Heritage Days is held in downtown Remus in mid-July every year; the Wheatland Folk Music Festival, a nationally known festival celebrating bluegrass and other traditional music, is held in Remus each September; and the Wheatland Music Organization is headquartered in Remus. See Exhibit G. The Wheatland Township Library also is located in downtown Remus.

### **Relocation Issues**

9. Channel 255A was initially allotted to Walhalla, which the Commission recognized as a community for allocation purposes even though it had only seven businesses and a population of 380 people. Remus, in comparison, has 33 businesses in its downtown area (26 on the main street and seven on adjacent streets) and a population of 480 people. Also, Walhalla's main draw is the summer tourist business, while Remus is a year-round community.

Remus has a significant community identity that deserves to have its own broadcast service. The allocation of the requested channel at Remus will provide a first local service to this larger, more important, community, which is not served by any other broadcast service within Mecosta County. There are no aural services licensed within 15 air miles of Remus and the only primary signal reaching the town is from Mt. Pleasant, with transmitting facilities nearly 28 miles away in neighboring Isabella County. Walhalla receives city-grade FM service (80dbu) from one Class C1 and two Class C3 stations.

10. Reallotment of Channel 255A from Walhalla to Remus would also serve the public interest because it would remove an unoccupied channel from one community in order to provide the first allocation to a larger population in another community. See Amendment of the Commission's Rules Regarding Modification of FM and TV Authorizations to Specify a New Community of License, 5 FCC Rcd 7094, 7096 (1990) (provision of first local service is a high priority in the allotment proceeding). Moreover, the prohibition on removing Walhalla's only aural service does not apply since Channel 255A is neither occupied nor applied for.

11. Remus clearly has the social, economic, and cultural indicia to qualify as a community for allotment purposes, and the public interest would be served by providing the residents of Remus with their first local aural service.

#### **Other Matters**


12. WIAR Upgrade Benefit. With respect to the proposed WIAR(FM) upgrade, the attached engineering report shows that a Class C3 facility at Honor will provide 1mV/m or better service to 79,839 people, a 124 percent increase over its potential Class A population coverage of 35,699. No change in WIAR's site is necessary.

13. Reimbursement. Northern will reimburse the licensee of WKLA(FM), Ludington, for the reasonable costs it incurs in changing frequencies from Channel 292A to 254A.

**Conclusion**

14. Grant of the proposed modifications to the FM Table of Allotments will provide the first aural service to Remus, Michigan, and increase and improve service to the communities of Honor and Bear Lake, Michigan. Should the Commission substitute Channel 264C3 for Channel 263A at Honor as proposed, Northern will apply for the new facilities and construct and operate on Channel 264C3 once its application is approved. For the foregoing reasons, Northern Radio of Michigan, Inc. requests the Commission grant its proposed modifications.

I am a Radio Engineer, an employee in the firm of Carl T. Jones Corporation with offices located in Springfield, Virginia. My education and experience are a matter of record with the Federal Communications Commission.

This office has been authorized by Northern Radio of Michigan, Inc., licensee of WIAR(FM), Honor, Michigan, to prepare this statement in support of a Petition to Amend the FM Table of Allotments, Section 73.202(b) of the FCC Rules. The petitioner requests that Section 73.202(b) of the FCC Rules be modified in the following manner:

km southwest. The allotment reference coordinates for Channel 264C3 at Honor, Michigan are 44° 37' 25" N.L. and 86° 00' 19" W.L. The Honor allotment reference site meets the allotment standards, the minimum spacing requirements of §73.207 and the city-grade coverage requirements of §73.315 of the FCC Rules.

The current Honor, Michigan, Class A allotment serves a population of 35,699 persons within the maximum Class A primary service circle (28.3 km radius) computed without considering terrain effects. A full Class C3 facility operating from the proposed Channel 264C3 reference coordinates is predicted to encompass a population of 79,839 persons within the maximum Class C3 primary service circle (39.1 km radius). Consequently, the proposed arrangement of allotments would allow WIAR(FM) to upgrade to a Class C3 facility and potentially provide an additional 44,140 persons with primary service.

To accommodate upgrade at Honor, Michigan, the proponent requests a channel change and transmitter site change for WSRQ(FM), Bear Lake, Michigan. The consent of the licensee of WSRQ(FM) is contained elsewhere in this Petition.

Radio station WSRQ(FM) currently operates on channel 261A as a 3 kW ERP @ 100 meters HAAT Class A assignment. The current WSRQ(FM) transmitter site became short-spaced as a result of the Commission's revision of Section 73.207 to allow for a power increase for Class A stations to 6 kW ERP @ 100 meters HAAT. The proponent requests a change in channel to 291A and a change in the reference coordinates to 44°

17' 30" N.L. and 86° 13' 30" W.L. The proposed Bear Lake allotment reference site meets the allotment standards, the minimum spacing requirements of §73.207 and the city-grade coverage requirements of §73.315 of the FCC Rules. The proposed change at Bear Lake will enable radio station WSRQ(FM) to increase facilities to the full 6 kW Class A maximum power.

The current Bear Lake, Michigan, 3 kW Class A allotment serves a population of 15,468 persons within the maximum Class A primary service circle (24.2 km radius) computed without considering terrain effects. A full 6 kW Class A facility operating from the proposed Channel 291A reference coordinates is predicted to encompass a population of 23,222 persons within the maximum Class A primary service circle (28.3 km radius). Consequently, the proposed arrangement of allotments would allow WSRQ(FM) to upgrade to a 6 kW Class A facility and potentially provide an additional 7,754 persons with primary service.

To accommodate the channel change at Bear Lake, Michigan, the proponent requests a channel change for WKLA(FM), Ludington, Michigan. Radio station WKLA(FM) currently operates on channel 292A. The proponent requests channel 254A in lieu of channel 292A at Ludington, Michigan. The allocation reference coordinates for Channel 254A describe the existing WKLA(FM) licensed transmitter site, 44° 03' 27" N.L. and 86° 24' 58" W.L. The Ludington allotment reference site meets the allotment standards, the

minimum spacing requirements of §73.207 and the city-grade coverage requirements of §73.315 of the FCC Rules.

To accommodate the proposed channel change at Ludington, the proponent requests a change in reference coordinates and reallocation for a vacant, "first-come/first-serve", allotment on Channel 255A in Walhalla, Michigan. Specifically, the proponent requests that channel 255A be re-allotted to the larger, and more established community of Remus, Michigan, at reference coordinates 43° 36' 33" N.L. 85° 08' 13" W.L.<sup>1</sup>

An engineering study of all pertinent allotments, assignments and applications revealed that the Remus, Channel 255A, allotment reference site meets the allotment standards, the minimum spacing requirements of §73.207 and the city grade coverage requirements of §73.315 of the FCC Rules.


