ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that the Prehearing Conference that was held and conducted on March 27, 2000, IS CONTINUED until 11:00 a.m. **March 31, 2000.**

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that on March 30, 2000, the parties shall submit a joint proposed schedule for the completion of discovery on all remaining issues and recommended procedural dates for the exchange of Trial Briefs, the marking and receipt of documents/transcripts in evidence at an Admissions Session,¹ reasonably contiguous hearing dates for all remaining issues, and estimated dates for the submission of proposed findings and conclusions and reply findings and conclusions.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Reading Broadcasting, Inc. and Adams Communications Corporation shall consider the sharing of costs for the copying of programming videotapes in the most expeditious manner.

¹ The parties are to use loose-leaf notebooks in submitting documents at hearing in order to assure orderly docket retention for appeal/review. That requirement applies only to documents which are marked and offered into evidence. The parties are reminded of the fundamental requirements for assembling documents and for the preparation of Trial Briefs as set forth in Order FCC 99M-42 released July 15, 1999. It is noted that transcripts of public witnesses are being offered into evidence in lieu of live testimony. Those public witness transcripts are paginated and when marked and received in evidence do not require being placed in loose-leaf notebooks.


