Dear Ms. Salas:

In 1995, the predecessor of MediaOne, Continental Cablevision, Inc. ("Continental"), entered into a Social Contract with the Federal Communications Commission, settling all outstanding rate complaints and committing to, among other things, increased investment in its broadband systems. The Social Contract was later amended in 1996 to cover various properties acquired by Continental Cablevision, Inc. and to provide some incentives to continue to rebuild and upgrade its systems. A further amendment extended the Social Contract to certain additional properties later acquired by MediaOne. *In the Matter of Continental Cablevision, Inc.*, Order, DA97-1400 (adopted July 2, 1997).

On May 6, 1999 AT&T and MediaOne entered into an agreement whereby MediaOne would merge into a wholly owned subsidiary of AT&T and be owned and controlled by AT&T.

In a letter submitted by the County of Los Angeles, Department of Consumer Affairs, on January 18, 2000, the County raised the question of whether AT&T was committed to fulfilling the social contract obligations previously adopted by MediaOne. This is to provide notice, pursuant to Section III H. 2. of the 1995 Social Contract, that
