
By the Assistant General Counsel, Administrative Law Division:

1. Now before the Commission are: (1) Initial Decision of Administrative Law Judge Arthur I. Steinberg, FCC 99D-03, released August 16, 1999; (2) Exceptions to Initial Decision filed October 20, 1999 by Universal Broadcasting of New York, Inc.; (3) Mass Media Bureau's Exceptions to Initial Decision filed October 20, 1999; (4) Reply of Gerard A. Turro to Exceptions filed November 15, 1999; (5) Reply to Exceptions filed November 15, 1999 by Monticello Mountaintop Broadcasting, Inc.; (6) Motion for Expedited Processing filed October 20, 1999 by Universal; (7) Renewed Petition for Extraordinary Relief and Issuance of an Order Requiring Turro to Come into Immediate Compliance with 47 C.F.R. § 74.1232 filed October 20, 1999 by Universal; (8) Supplement to Petition to Deny and Post-Hearing Statement of Position of Universal filed October 20, 1999; (9) Bureau's Opposition to Renewed Petition for Extraordinary Relief filed October 26, 1999; (10) Opposition to Renewed Petition for Extraordinary Relief filed November 1, 1999 by Monticello; (11) Opposition of Turro to Renewed Petition for Extraordinary Relief filed November 1, 1999; and (k) Consolidated Reply to Oppositions to Renewed Petition for Extraordinary Relief filed November 8, 1999 by Universal.

2. It is the Commission's policy, where an adjudicatory proceeding is before the Commission for issuance of a final order or decision, to act in such cases within five months of the last responsive pleading, or else issue an order indicating that additional time will be required. See 47 C.F.R. §0.251(d); Comparative Hearing Process, 6 FCC Rcd 157, 164 ¶50 (1991). Additional time is required for resolution of the issues raised by the pleadings in this proceeding.

3. ACCORDINGLY, IT IS ORDERED, pursuant to the authority delegated under 47 C.F.R. §0.251(d), that additional time WILL BE REQUIRED for disposition of the pleadings in this proceeding.
