**ORDER**

Adopted: May 4, 2000

1. On April 24, 2000 the Bell Atlantic Telephone Companies (Bell Atlantic) filed Transmittal No. 1277 to revise Tariff F.C.C. Nos.1 and 11, Access Service, Packet Data Services to allow interconnection between Bell Atlantic's Asynchronous Transfer Mode-Cell Relay Service (ATM-CSR) and Collocated Interconnection Service (CIS). ATM-CRS facilitates new services and applications requiring increasingly large amounts of bandwidths. CIS provides for central office interconnection of Bell Atlantic-provided interstate access services and facilities and facilities to collocator provided fiber optic facilities. Bell Atlantic is proposing monthly, 3-year and 5-year rates for the ATM-CRS DS3 CIS port connection.

2. Transmittal No. 1277 raises the same issues regarding rate levels, rate structures, and terms and conditions of collocation services as those that are subject to the investigation of Bell Atlantic's Tariff F.C.C. Nos. 1 and 11, Access Service, expanded interconnection service offering.<sup>1</sup> Therefore, Transmittal No. 1277 is suspended for one day and will be subject to the investigation initiated in the Investigation of Bell Atlantic's New Expanded Interconnection Offerings (*Bell Atlantic Suspension Order*), and the *Virtual Collocation Phase I Order*<sup>2</sup> and the Investigation of NYNEX Telephone

Companies' New Virtual Expanded Interconnection Offerings.<sup>3</sup> Any rates proposed in this transmittal will be subject to an accounting order to facilitate any refunds that may later prove necessary.

3. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that, pursuant to Section 204(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 204(a), and the authority delegated pursuant to Sections 0.91 and 0.291 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 0.91, 0.291, the revisions to Bell Atlantic's Tariff F.C.C. Nos. 1 and 11, filed under Transmittal No. 1277, ARE SUSPENDED for one day from the effective date and an investigation of the referenced transmittal is instituted and incorporated within CC Docket Nos. 94-097, 96-165, and 98-240.

4. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that BELL ATLANTIC SHALL FILE tariff revisions within five business days of the release date of this Order to reflect this suspension.

5. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pursuant to Sections 4(i) and 204(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended 47 U.S.C. §§ 154(i) and 204(a), BELL ATLANTIC shall keep accurate account of all amounts received by reason of the rates that are subject of this investigation.
