**ORDER**

Adopted: April 28, 2000

1. On April 17, 2000 the Bell Atlantic Telephone Companies (Bell Atlantic) filed Transmittal No. 1273 to revise Bell Atlantic's Tariff F.C.C. No.1, Access Service, Collocated Interconnection. One of the revisions proposed in Transmittal No. 1273, which is currently scheduled to become effective on May 2, 2000, is to introduce a new service option for Bell Atlantic's IntelliLight Shared Single Path (ISSP) service to allow termination at a Collocated Interconnection arrangement. Other revisions clarify the application of ISSP Optional Features and Functions, and correct a miscellaneous typographical error. No petitions have been filed against this transmittal.

2. Transmittal No. 1273 raises the same issues regarding rate levels, rate structures, and terms and conditions of physical and virtual collocation services as those that are subject to the investigation of Bell Atlantic's Tariff F.C.C. No. 1, expanded interconnection service offering. Therefore, Transmittal No. 1273, as regards the revisions for collocation services, is suspended for one day and will be subject to the investigation initiated in the Investigation of Bell Atlantic's New Expanded Interconnection Offerings (*Bell Atlantic Suspension Order*), and the *Virtual Collocation Tariff Suspension Order*.<sup>1</sup> Any rates proposed in this transmittal will be subject to an accounting order to facilitate any refunds that may later prove necessary.



Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that, pursuant to Section 204(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 204(a), and the authority delegated pursuant to Sections 0.91 and 0.291 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 0.91, 0.291, the revisions regarding collocation services to Bell Atlantic's Tariff F.C.C. No.1, filed under Transmittal No. 1273, ARE SUSPENDED for one day from the effective date and an investigation of the referenced transmittal is instituted and incorporated within CC Docket Nos. 96-165 and 94-97.

4. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that BELL ATLANTIC SHALL FILE tariff revisions within five business days of the release date of this Order to reflect this suspension.

5. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pursuant to Sections 4(i) and 204(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended 47 U.S.C. §§ 154(i) and 204(a), the BELL ATLANTIC Companies shall keep an accurate account of all amounts received by reason of the rates that are subject of this investigation.
