Yesterday afternoon, Rich Rubin, Rich Kurth, Misa Lawrence and I met with Jane Jackson, Rich Lerner, Tamara Preiss, Judy Nitsche, R. L. Smith, Jim Lichford, Josephine Scarlett, Renee Licht, Vienna Jordan, Steve Funkhouser, and Larry Barnes from the Competitive Pricing Division, Lisa Choi from the International Bureau and Calvin Howell from the Consumer Information Bureau to discuss implementation processes related to detariffing. The implementation process and transition issues were discussed in the context of the Commission detariffing Orders and the provisions of the Public Notice issued on May 9th.

Specifically, AT&T discussed implementation process issues and potential customer confusion associated with the negotiation, provisioning, billing and tariffing of bundled domestic and international long term service agreements (i.e., Contract Tariffs and VTNS Options). AT&T provided a proposal that would simplify the detariffing of domestic services from bundled domestic and international long term service offerings. The proposal consisted of including a disclaimer banner (attached) with all international long term service agreement tariff filings. Discussion also included AT&T's view as the importance of linking International detariffing with the domestic detariffing schedule.

Two copies of this Notice are being submitted to the Secretary of the FCC in accordance with Section 1.1206 (b) of the Commission's rules.
