Re: Ex Parte Communication: In the Matter of Policy and Rules Concerning the Interstate, Interexchange Marketplace (Detariffing Order), CC Docket No. 96-61

Dear Ms. Salas:

On May 19, 2000, Sprint employees Marybeth Banks and the undersigned met with FCC staff to discuss certain implementation issues related to the 9-month transition period that non-dominant interexchange carriers have been allowed to detariff their domestic interstate offerings. Participating on behalf of the FCC were Jane Jackson, Chief, Competitive Pricing Division, Common Carrier Bureau, Judy Nitsche, Larry Barnes, R.L. Smith, Vienna Jordan, Tamara Preiss, Steve Funkhouser, Jim Lichford and Renee Terry, all of the Competitive Pricing Division, Lisa Choi of the International Bureau, and Calvin Howell of the Consumer Information Bureau.


Sprint explained that carriers should be able to continue to file new and revised tariffs for their contract offerings that bundled domestic and international offerings, at least during the transition period, with a notation that the rates, terms and conditions pertaining to the domestic portion of such bundled offering were being filed for informational purposes only and did not constitute a tariff filed pursuant to Section 203(a) of the Act. Sprint also sought to clarify that, after the transition, it would be able to tariff the minimum annual commitment (MAC) agreed to by the customer in its international tariff with a list of the non-tariffed or non-jurisdictional services that contributed to the MAC and thereby avoid the necessity of creating an "interntional only" MAC. And, Sprint discussed in general terms its initial thinking as to how it would implement the requirement to post its domestic offerings on the Internet.
