Dear Ms. Salas:

Yesterday I discussed with Kyle Dixon, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Powell, matters related to the referenced proceedings. In particular, I urged that the Commission approach with skepticism any proposed significant modifications to the plan offered by the Coalition for Affordable Local and Long Distance Services ("CALLS"). As proposed, the CALLS plan would provide the industry considerable certainty concerning access and related issues that facilitates business planning and fosters prospects for competition. Significant changes to the plan, particularly as implementation potentially nears, could undermine marketplace certainty, create unnecessary confusion, and disrupt business planning activities. My statements were consistent with the views reflected in the written submissions of AT&T and CALLS in these proceedings.
