ORDER

1. On April 25, 2000 Citizens Telecommunications Companies (Citizens) filed Transmittal No.75 to revise Tariff F.C.C. No.1, Access Services. Citizens is proposing, among other things, to revise its Expanded Interconnection Service rates for AC power and extend the application of its Interconnection Service offerings.

2. Transmittal No. 75 raises the same issues regarding rate levels, rate structures, and terms and conditions of collocation services as those that are subject to the investigation of Citizens' Tariff F.C.C. No. 1, Access Service, Expanded Interconnection Services offering.¹ Therefore, with respect to any matters concerning Expanded Interconnection Services, Transmittal No. 75 is suspended for one day and will be subject to the investigation initiated in the Matter of Citizens Telecommunications Companies Revisions to Tariff F.C.C. No.1.² Any rates proposed in this transmittal will be subject to an accounting order to facilitate any refunds that may later prove necessary.

3. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that, pursuant to Section 204(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 204(a), and the authority delegated pursuant to Sections 0.91 and 0.291 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 0.91, 0.291, the revisions to Citizens' Tariff F.C.C. Nos. 1 applicable to Expanded Interconnection Service offerings filed under Transmittal No. 75, ARE SUSPENDED for

one day from the effective date and an investigation of the referenced transmittal is instituted and incorporated within CC Docket No. 97-240.

4. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Citizens Telecommunications Companies SHALL FILE tariff revisions within five business days of the release date of this Order to reflect this suspension.

5. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pursuant to Sections 4(i) and 204(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended 47 U.S.C. §§ 154(i) and 204(a), Citizens Telecommunications Companies shall keep accurate account of all amounts received by reason of the rates that are subject of this investigation.
