**ORDER**

Issued: June 15, 2000      Released: June 19, 2000

This will memorialize rulings that were made during a telephone conference call on June 15, 2000, at 2:30 p.m. regarding discovery of documents from Telemundo Network Group, Inc. ("Telemundo") concerning Phase III issues. The participants were counsel for Reading Broadcasting, Inc., counsel for Telemundo and the undersigned Presiding Judge.

The production of documents by Telemundo in response to Order FCC 00M-36 and the in camera review by the undersigned are completed and Telemundo has been determined to have met its obligation to produce documentary evidence.

The order of witnesses for Monday June 19, 2000, was changed to permit the testimony of M. Anne Swanson, Esquire, commencing at 1:30 p.m. The testimony of Mr. Paul Sherwood will be heard the same day commencing at 10:00 a.m.<sup>1</sup>

<sup>1</sup> This is a change in the order of witnesses to accommodate Ms. Swanson. Mr. Sherwood is travelling from out of town. Therefore, the hearing will start 30 minutes later in order to accommodate his travel time.

Counsel for Reading was instructed that no later than 4:00 p.m. (earlier if possible) on Friday, June 16, 2000, counsel for Reading shall serve counsel for Telemundo with a list of the documents that are intended for use in the examination of Ms. Swanson.<sup>2</sup>
