**ORDER**

By the Accounting Policy Division:

1. This Order dismisses the Letter of Appeal of Algonquin Regional High School (Algonquin) of Northboro, Massachusetts, seeking review of a decision issued by the Universal Service Administrative Company's Schools and Libraries Division on June 22, 1999.<sup>1</sup> The Commission received Algonquin's Letter of Appeal on February 12, 2000.<sup>2</sup> Under section 54.720 of the Commission's rules,<sup>3</sup> any such appeal must be filed within 30 days of the issuance of the decision as to which review is sought. Documents are considered to be filed with the Commission only upon receipt.<sup>4</sup> Because the instant Letter of Appeal was not filed within the specified 30-day period, it will be dismissed without further consideration.
