We request that you complete the standard Phase I E9-1-1 Service Agreement and Amendment (available on the CSEC web site at www.911.state.tx.us) for each individual COG indicated above. The agreement should be complete, with a detailed cost model and schematic diagrams attached for our review. The completed contract and amendment should be sent to CSEC offices, in duplicate originals, no later than February 18, 2000. The CSEC will coordinate the execution of the contracts with each individual COG, and will subsequently return one of the fully executed originals to your

company. We will notify both parties, COGs and Wireless Service Providers, when the contracts are executed.

It is important that each carrier provide the CSEC with a cost model that includes costs by specific components such as trunking, database, SCP functionality, and other related costs. It is incumbent upon the CSEC to review all costs to ensure that we procure services that provide the best value, and avoid cost and service duplication. As you are aware, the CSEC has procured the services of SCC Communications to provide SCP services and wireless database services to the state program at a negotiated contract price. Wireless Service Providers are under no obligation to utilize all of these services. However, since some of these services, specifically the SCP function, may be provided to the Wireless Service Provider by other sources, the CSEC has the responsibility to closely examine all costs to avoid any possible cost duplication and to ensure that the State program receives the best possible comparative value. A complete and detailed cost model is essential in making this determination.

The CSEC wishes to assist the Wireless Service Providers in facilitating the successful implementation of wireless E9-1-1 service as much as possible. Enclosed you will find information regarding the COGs and Counties in which you have a presence, the PSAP name, Network Provider, as well as Selective Router name and type, to assist you in planning your wireless implementation. In order that we may further assist you in this matter, please provide the CSEC with a written list of any needed information with your contract submission. The CSEC will make every effort to expedite these requests to provide the information to you as soon as possible.

The CSEC encourages you to begin all necessary activities immediately in order for your company to deploy Phase I service by the above noted implementation due date. As the CSEC's 9-1-1 database services provider, SCC Communications is providing project management support to the wireless implementation project and will be providing you with information on processes, procedures and data packets for each of the COGs identified in this letter.
