
Dear Director:

Dear Senator Johnston,

I am writing in regard to recent actions about to be undertaken by the Federal Communications Commission. As you no doubt know the FCC wants to license numerous low-power FM radio stations, which will result in interference for tens of thousands of listeners on an already congested radio dial. This is very disturbing to us. We operate two radio stations in Northern California and 10 translators.

We have been in operation now for 25 years and have many, many loyal listeners who have not only listened to us over the years but supported us for many years and have been the underlying reason for our growth.

Senator Gregg (R-NH) has recently introduced a bill, S 2068, "The Radio Broadcasting Preservation Act of 2000." This bill is similar to House bill H.R. 3439, which unanimously passed the House Commerce Telecommunications Subcommittee and which would retroactively prevent the Commission from instituting low-power FM service. I am writing to ask for your help in opposing this threat by co-sponsoring S. 2068.

The FCC is ignoring credible research, which convincingly foretells of the interference that will be the most notable result of these actions. In fact FCC Commissioners Powell and Furchtgott-Roth have questioned the wisdom of adopting the Report and Order prior to resolving the interference issue. Thus, one might suspect that the FCC's decision has motivations beyond providing service to undeserved groups, churches and communities. Hopefully unintended but certainly inevitable is the threat to established broadcasters.

In KYCC & KCJH average market, we serve numerous local churches by providing public service announcements and involvement in church community events. In all probability many of our loyal listeners will be unable to listen to us due to interfering signals. Listeners for many years now have supported this ministry and it has become a regular part of their daily lives. There will be a great sadness in their hearts and a lot of frustration.

Still fresh in the memory of many broadcasters is a comparable event in the 80's when the commission revised its rules to allow thousands of new stations on the air, ostensibly to provide service to undeserved communities. The result was nearly disastrous for commercial radio, and later caused the FCC to modify its ownership rules which opened the door for the present industry consolidation frenzy. Now we wonder if the Commission's recent action


