



LEE'S SUMMIT JOURNAL

OUR HISTORY

Established in 1881, The Lee's Summit Journal has been serving the community for more than 118 years, and today remains one of the oldest businesses in Lee's Summit. The Journal's 119th year began with the first issue of July, 2000 and the July 31st, 1997, issue was the first to be put on the World Wide Web.

During that 119 years there have been only seven different owners. The Journal has been in a number different locations. Since, 1965 there have been four different locations, having moved into the present one at 415 S.E. Douglas in August 1977.

The Journal had been published weekly along with the Journal-Advertiser until 1977 a Friday edition was added in September 1977 to better serve the news and advertising needs of the growing community As Lee's Summit continued to grow, so did the Journal and a Monday edition was added in 1990.

In 1965 the Journal was in a building with approximately 1,500 square feet with seven full-time employees. The Journal now employs about 25 full time, 10 part time and more than 20 contract carriers in its present location, which includes a 3,000-square-foot expansion for additional office and warehouse space that was completed in 1997.

The Journal is under the leadership of interim publisher Susan Cantrell, who will serve in that capacity until a permanent publisher is selected. The management staff include: Rogena Adams, office administrator; Ken Hatfield, news editor; Sandy Woltkamp, advertising director; Teresa Feagan, graphics manager; Kay Barrickman, Internet and JoAnne McDaniel, circulation manager.



Beginning as a primarily suburban bedroom community, Lee's Summit has emerged as a diversified city with over 100 manufacturers and related companies. Over 1700 businesses operate in Lee's Summit's 64 square miles. In 1997 the value of new commercial development permits increased by 37% and square footage increased 1.4 million square feet.

Lee's Summit has a vibrant downtown area with over 100 service, specialty and retail shops. In 1990, when Downtown Lee's Summit Main Street, Inc. started the revitalization program there were 19 empty store fronts in the 6-block area known as the Vision of the Heart area. For the past five years there are seldom any vacant ground level spaces for more than a 3-month period. There are 10 eating establishments offering a variety of foods so you can eat and shop in this unique, safe, and vibrant area where you will probably do business with your friends and neighbors.



Downtown Lee's Summit Main Street sponsors many events through the year that bring people into Lee's Summit as well as the downtown area. Their Old Tyme Days craft festival the first week in June attracts an average of 80,000 visitors. The Holiday Lights in November and December have been



compared favorably to the Plaza Christmas lights.

Downtown Lee's Summit Main Street also sponsors a Farmer's Market and Music in the Park during the summer and a Bunny Hop in the spring and a Halloween Parade in the fall. These events all serve to strengthen the tax base in Lee's Summit. Anyone interested in supporting this revitalization program may contact the DLSMS office at 246-6598.

The Lee's Summit Economic Development Council, EDC, works to assist and encourage companies to locate facilities and jobs or to expand existing facilities in Lee's Summit. The EDC has identified the need to focus on quality companies with growth potential, especially in technology industries while also providing information to encourage market driven retail development. The EDC has identified the following seven areas of emphasis: pharmaceutical preparations and drugs, electronics assembly or manufacturing, electronic commerce, corporate support or dedicated call centers, distribution facilities, high value materials and medium sized company headquarters. Summit Technology center on Chipman Road, Rollin's Meadows, Douglas Square, 291 Hwy. South Corridor, I-470 and Colbern Road are all sites for future development. For more information call 525-6617.
