

In fiscal year 1999-2000, the division will continue to emphasize preventive maintenance, including increased crack sealing efforts. Staff will also focus on completion of the inventory and inspection of the street and stormwater networks, as well as all signs, signals and bridges throughout the community to provide improved control and maintenance

. SPECIAL REVENUE FUNDS

PARKS AND RECREATION

The Parks and Recreation Fund is funded primarily by property tax revenues and user fees. Its budget is approved by an independent board, whose members are recommended by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council.

In fiscal year 1999-2000, the Parks and Recreation Department will continue to provide a wide variety of leisure activities to serve all city residents. In addition, the recommended budget focuses on several program initiatives identified by the Park Board as areas that should be addressed; these program initiatives are in the areas of family, youth and adult activities. A new position will be added in the coming fiscal year to enhance the department's accounting and customer service efforts.

The proposed budget continues the Parks and Recreation Department's efforts to implement the "Legacy for Tomorrow" plan. Significant resources will be dedicated to the development of City Park in the coming fiscal year, which will pose a considerable challenge to the Parks and Recreation Department.

In addition, the department will focus on acquisition, development and renovation of neighborhood parks. Park renovation projects in fiscal year 1999-2000 include Banner Park, Lowenstein Park and McKee Park. The development of Bowlin Road Park and the acquisition of land for South Park are also planned. Other priorities in the coming fiscal year include continued acquisition and development of the city's greenway system and the development of an open space dedication policy.

BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY FUND

In April 1998, the residents of Lee's Summit authorized a five percent guest tax on hotels and motels located within the city limits. The Business and Industry Fund was established to account for the financial activity associated with this tax, which is used to promote business and industry within the city. The proposed budget includes continued funding for Downtown Main Street and the Lee's Summit Economic Development Council.

NORTHEAST TAX INCREMENT FINANCING FUND

This special allocation fund was established to receive the incremental taxes generated from the Northeast industrial park development and service the corresponding debt financing relating to the infrastructure improvements. Prior to this last year, the incremental taxes have been inadequate to cover the annual debt service, requiring an interfund loan from the city's General Fund. With the addition of several new businesses and the redevelopment of the former Chapel Woods golf course, this fund is expected to meet the current debt service payments plus repay the loan from the General Fund within the 11 years remaining on the TIF plan.

ROAD EXCISE AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT SALES TAX FUND

A new fund in the 1999-2000 fiscal year is the Road Excise and Capital Improvement Sales Tax Fund. The excise tax is a license tax collected on new construction. This tax, together with the recently approved one half cent sales tax increase, is intended to provide capital project funding for several major road projects in the city over the next 10 years. Included in the budget is funding for the continuation of the Ward Road widening and reconstruction project.

GENERAL OBLIGATION DEBT SERVICE FUND

This fund is used to establish the tax levy to service the principal and interest payments on the city's approximate \$26.4 million of outstanding general obligation bonds. The city has \$3 million of authorized but unissued debt remaining from the 1995 road improvement election. It is anticipated that this debt will be issued in the summer of 1999 to provide funding of the Todd George Road Phase II and Colbern Road widening projects. Both of these projects will also receive matching federal grant funding. The debt service tax levy is expected to remain at \$.48 per \$100 of assessed valuation in fiscal year 1999-2000.

ENTERPRISE FUNDS

AIRPORT OPERATING FUND

The Municipal Airport, operated and maintained by the Airport Division of the Public Works Department, provides general aviation service to the metropolitan area seven days a week, and is equipped with both a north/south and a crosswind runway.

The proposed budget for fiscal year 1999-2000 includes funding

for the construction of a new access taxiway and aircraft parking area, continued asphalt pavement cracksealing and seal coating to extend the life of pavement areas. In addition, the west T-hangar taxiway will be reconstructed. Funding is also included for continued land acquisition to provide for runway protection zones and the development of future Fixed Based Operator (FBO) facilities. The majority of funding for these projects will be provided through federal and state grants. The development of additional hangars and FBO facilities will also be a major emphasis in the coming year.

SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FUND

The Solid Waste Division of the Public Works Department operates the Resource Recovery Park, which includes the Lee's Summit Landfill, a recycling center, a household hazardous waste facility and a composting site. The division is funded primarily by waste tipping fees, with the remainder of the operating funds coming from sales of compost and recyclable materials.

On-going changes in the solid waste market will require close monitoring of the demand for service and pricing schedule at the Resource Recovery Park to ensure that the long-term financial and service goals of the landfill are achieved. During fiscal year 1999-2000, major improvements are planned for the Resource Recovery Park. These improvements include the addition of a composting storage and loading facility, development of a brush unloading area, construction of an office and employee building, major site entrance improvements, and rehabilitation of the compost pad area. The tub grinder unit will be replaced, thereby increasing the ability to effectively process brush and wood waste.

WATER UTILITIES FUND

The Water Utilities Department is organized into three divisions (Engineering, Operations, and Support Services) and serves approximately 25,000 customers. Funding is provided by two major revenue sources: water sales and sewer charges.

Water rates have remained relatively unchanged since 1986. Since this time, the only rate changes have been an increased rate for consumption above the system average and the adoption of block rates to encourage water conservation. As noted in the fiscal year 1998-1999 budget message, a water rate increase was anticipated for fiscal year 1999-2000.

To comply with bond covenant requirements and fund required system maintenance and other operational expenses, an adjustment in water and sewer rates is recommended in fiscal

year 1999-2000. The degree to which rates must be adjusted in the coming fiscal year depends on whether or not the Council believes rates should be adjusted incrementally over a period of time versus a more significant adjustment in a single year.

During fiscal year 1998-1999, both a water master plan and a sewer master plan were completed. These master plans will provide significant guidance in the planning and construction of infrastructure improvements, including internal system improvements necessary to utilize the additional water supply anticipated to be purchased from the City of Kansas City, Missouri. In addition, the sewer system master plan will allow the department to better address present and future sewer issues through the revision of design criteria to reflect actual conditions in Lee's Summit.

One area of major concern that will require close monitoring by staff in fiscal year 1999-2000 will be the future of the Little Blue Valley Sewer District (LBVSD). Its facilities are currently at design capacity and are experiencing difficulties with treating the excessive infiltration inflow entering the system. LBVSD is in the process of completing a strategic and master plan to address issues such as rehabilitation and expansion of its facilities. It is possible that the city may have to finance improvements at LBVSD's facilities to provide needed capacity as Lee's Summit is currently the district's largest user and has the most potential for growth. These issues may result in increased rates for the City of Lee's Summit and its residents.

During the coming fiscal year, the Water Utilities staff will continue its aggressive preventative maintenance program. The city's smoke testing and televising of sewer lines identify infrastructure in need of repair or replacement, with the goal of reducing infiltration and inflow to the system. In addition, staff will continue to concentrate on the inspection of new sewer mains to ensure proper construction prior to city acceptance.

INTERNAL SERVICES FUNDS

Several city departments provide internal service functions to other city departments. In order to properly allocate the expenses back to the respective funds and departments, the city utilizes internal service funds. These funds are described in greater detail below.

FLEET OPERATIONS

The Fleet Division of the Administration Department is responsible for the acquisition, disposal, and the maintenance and repair of the city's motor fleet and associated equipment. The

respective user departments are assessed a charge for direct labor and overhead costs when their equipment is serviced. This fund also serves as the "leasing agent" for all motor fleet vehicles. All departments pay an annual fee for their vehicles, which is then set aside to provide funding for the subsequent replacement of the vehicle. This system has allowed the city's operating departments to evenly fund their capital outlay expenses.

During the 1998-1999 fiscal year, the most significant change was the redefinition of the maintenance shop supervisor position. The position's duties were redefined to greater emphasize customer service and departmental coordination. In addition, an additional vehicle was assigned to the motor pool fleet and a new account was established in the Vehicle Equipment Replacement Program fund to ensure that motor pool vehicles are replaced in a timely fashion.

In fiscal year 1999-2000, the Fleet Division will embark on a comprehensive benchmarking study of similar fleets to evaluate the division's performance in regard to cost-efficiency and productivity. As part of this process, a customer service survey process will be initiated. Based on the results of the benchmarking study and the customer service survey, new policies and procedures will be implemented to improve the overall effectiveness of the division. Another area of emphasis will be the evaluation of alternatives for the procurement of parts and related supplies, including use of the city's business procurement program and the outsourcing of parts inventory.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES

Information Technology Services (ITS), a division of the Administration Department, provides for the purchase, maintenance and repair of data processing equipment and software in a manner very similar to Fleet Operations. This provides for the timely replacement of equipment without significant expenditure fluctuations.

The top priority in fiscal year 1999-2000 will be the continued implementation of the Y2K Compliance Initiative. During fiscal year 1998-1999, the city's Y2K plan has progressed on schedule with the assistance of a new position authorized mid-year by the City Council. Several non-Y2K compliant systems have been replaced or upgraded. Other Y2K projects planned for the coming year include the upgrading of the voice mail and electronic mail systems and the courts and payroll software applications.

The proposed budget includes a change in the timeframe used for the replacement of PCs and printers in the city's Managed

Equipment Replacement Program. The timeframe has been reduced from five years to three years to reflect the frequent advances in technology.

UNEMPLOYMENT TRUST FUND

This fund was established in fiscal year 1978-1979 to account for self-insurance funding of any unemployment claims filed by former city employees. Initially, individual departments were assessed a fee per employee to pay claims incurred. Interest income earned on accumulated balances have been sufficient to defer any user department contributions since fiscal year 1981-1982; no contributions are anticipated to be required in the near future.

SELF INSURANCE RESERVE TRUST FUND

This fund was created to account for receipt of refunds and special assessments from the city's insurance provider, Mid-America Regional Trust Insurance Council (MARCIT). The city has experienced increases and special assessments as great as 30 percent in some years, while receiving credits or refunds in other years. This fund is intended to accumulate and disburse funds in a manner that provides level and consistent payments for insurance coverage. Ultimately, this fund is expected to provide the basis for a reserve fund should the city choose to self-insure its liabilities. The budget for fiscal year 1998-1999 included a transfer from this trust fund to cover a surcharge for worker's compensation premiums.

FIDUCIARY FUNDS

Fiduciary funds are used to account for assets held by governmental units in a trustee capacity or as an agent for individual, private organizations, other governmental units and/or other funds. Expendable trust funds are used to account for assets held in trust by the city for others. The city's expendable trust funds include the Community Development Block Grant Entitlement Fund, Cemetery Trust Fund, Landfill Post-Closure Trust Fund, and Road and Bridge Escrow Trust Fund.

The CDBG Entitlement Fund was established to account for federal funding passed through to other agencies as part of the Department of Housing and Urban Development Community Development Block Grant Program.

The Cemetery Trust Fund was created to account for plot and monument sales for perpetual care funding of the City Municipal Cemetery. This fund was closed at the end of the 1975-1976 fiscal year after several years of expenditures in excess of

revenues. A revised schedule of fees and charges, as well as an annual transfer from the General Fund, are expected to provide an endowment designed to make the cemetery self-sufficient after all grave spaces have been sold.

The Post-Closure Trust Fund was established to account for the reservation of funds for post-closure monitoring and remediation of the landfill facility.

Created in fiscal year 1997-1998, the Road and Bridge Escrow Trust Fund accounts for escrow deposits from developers held by the city for future infrastructure improvements. If the deposits are not used for the improvements within 15 years, they are returned with interest to the developer.

SUMMARY

Adopting the budget is one of the most important actions that a City Council takes each year, serving as an action, operation and financial plan for the delivery of city services. The budget also serves as a communication tool from the city to the citizens of Lee's Summit, as well as members of the financial community.

This budget was prepared to lay the foundation for restructuring Lee's Summit's financial position relative to tightening revenue sources. The goal is to contain costs within revenue limits and to maintain services, while at the same time improving their cost effectiveness.

The staff and I look forward to working with you to finalize a budget for fiscal year 1999-2000 that meets the expectations of the Mayor and City Council and the residents of Lee's Summit.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

The Department of Planning and Development provides services to the development industry and the general community on land matters.

The Department is involved in both long-range and current planning and administers the city's Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance and Subdivision Ordinance. Long-range planning efforts include preparing current and future land use plans, updating the Comprehensive Plan, compiling statistics and preparing population projections.

Current planning includes the processing of applications for rezoning, special use permits, variances, development plans and subdivision plats. The planning staff reviews all applications and accompany plans and makes recommendations to the appropriate board. The department provides staff support for the Planning Commission, City Council, Board of Adjustments, Historic Preservation Commission, Community Development Committee, as well as ad hoc Committees appointed by the City Council or Planning Commission. The department also provides information to the general public, including realtors, appraisers, developers, contractors, citizens and others, regarding general and specific land use issues.
