Dear Ms. Salas:

Pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 76.503(g), AT&T Broadband, L.L.C. ("AT&T") hereby notifies the Commission that it anticipates that it will soon close transactions with Cablevision Systems Corp. in which AT&T will: (1) acquire Cablevision's Massachusetts cable system (serving approximately 195,000 subscribers); and (2) receive Cablevision's Boston and Brookline, Massachusetts systems (serving approximately 144,000 and 17,000 subscribers, respectively) in exchange for AT&T's New York cable systems (serving approximately 128,000 subscribers).

Since AT&T is already attributed with all of Cablevision's subscribers under the Commission's rules, the above transactions will have no effect on the number of MVPD subscribers which AT&T serves nationwide. Thus, based on available data, and assuming the most conservative interpretation of the Commission's current attribution rules, AT&T estimates that prior to this transaction it was attributed with approximately 35,336,000 MVPD subscribers,¹ and after this transaction it will be attributed with the same approximately 35,336,000 MVPD subscribers.

¹ This figure for AT&T subscribers prior to the Cablevision transactions is based on AT&T's subscriber certification letter filed with the Commission on July 25, 2000 in the above-captioned dockets regarding AT&T's acquisition of a cable system in Palo Alto, CA.



While AT&T recognizes that this level of attributable subscribers is greater than 30% of all MVPD subscribers nationwide,² AT&T notes that the Commission has allowed AT&T until May 19, 2001 to come into compliance with this limit.³


