Dear Ms. Roman Salas:

On September 20, 2000, I accompanied Mary Brooner of Motorola, Inc. at an *ex parte* meeting with staff members of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau on the Commission proceeding to implement provisions adopted in the Balanced Budget Act of 1997. Attending from the Bureau were Kathleen O'Brien-Ham, David Furth, Scot Stone, John Borkowski, Shellie Blakeney, Gary Michaels and Leora Hochstein.

In this meeting, Motorola and the staff discussed the status of the FCC's proceeding. In addition, Motorola reiterated its long-standing support for private wireless radio services and stated that spectrum auctions are not appropriate for distributing private wireless licenses. Motorola further noted, however, that 800 MHz commercial service providers such as Nextel are spectrum deficient and indicated its support for flexible policies provided that they do not undermine the fundamental integrity of the private wireless services.
