Subject: interference issues

Adam,

At our last meeting, you asked whether the only situation in which a terrestrial transmitter operating at 12.2-12.7 GHz could cause interference to a DBS receiver was one in which it was raining. Apparently, there are also cases in which the transmitter is so close to the DBS dish that interference would occur without any rain. Apparently, during the Northpoint tests from the USA Today bldg, the transmitter was moved from the rooftop to the side of the bldg because it was interfering with two DBS receivers. I'm not sure where those receivers were located, but apparently the interference occurred even when there was no rain.
