
Dear Ms. Salas:

On Wednesday, November 1, 2000, Lawrence R. Krevor, Senior Director of Government Affairs for Nextel Communications, Inc. ("Nextel"), and Leonard J. Kennedy, counsel for Nextel, met with Bryan Tramont, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Harold W. Furchtgott-Roth, regarding the above-referenced proceeding.

During the meeting, they discussed approaches to advance spectrum efficiency by eliminating restrictions on the use of fungible spectrum and the importance of allowing Business and Industrial/Land Transportation licensees the flexibility to transfer voluntarily their licenses to commercial mobile radio service providers or to engage in joint ventures with commercial providers.
