On Thursday November 16, 2000, Charles Griffin and I, both of AT&T, met with Deena Shetler, Legal Adviser to Commissioner Tristani, to discuss issues raised in the aforementioned docket. We stated that the Commission should deny the Verizon Massachusetts 271 application for the reasons set forth in the Reply Comments filed on November 2, 2000 and stressed the importance of the Commission rejecting Verizon's purported attempt to "cure" the application's pricing deficiencies with its October 13 filing.

The positions expressed by AT&T were consistent with those contained in the Comments and ex parte filings previously made in the aforementioned dockets. Two copies of this Notice are being submitted for each of the referenced proceedings in accordance with the Commission's rules.
