Commissoners:

Motorola with its filing of a Petition of Reconsideration about the MURS creation, fails to address the need for small groups of citizens to use VHF radio space. For example, I have found that the Low Power Radio Service does not work for theater groups I have work with because of the noise from the lighting system. I have also found that the Family Radio does not work because of the trees. I have found ham 2 meters works very well in both cases, so MURS should work also well. I have talked to many in the Red Cross, the hiking club, the bike club, and my own SAR team- who all have needs that MURS could fill. Also, as a ham, I think the problem that having to follow around key personnel during public events communications would be solved by MURS. Under Motorola's plans each of these groups could not use a radio under its Low Power Industrial/Business Radio Service". I therefore respectfully request that the Commission put aside Motorola's petition.

The Personal Radio Steering Group, Inc.(PRSG) also has filed a Petition for Reconsideration. I support most of the petition except for two matters. One I wish to leave the name alone because of matter two. Matter two deals with paragraph 18 of their petition. The PRSG wishes to do away with base to base (or point to point) communications. I would like a rule stating that all fixed point to point communications use horizontally polarized antennas. Also, if the power is less than a half a Watt to the antenna feedpoint, any horizontal gain antenna may be used. This will greatly reduce interference to mobile users. All other parts of the PRSG petition I support.

I am also aware that at least one petition is asking for grandfathering of BB radios. I think they should be given five years to find a solution.
