Re: *Ex Parte* - Inter-Carrier Compensation for ISP-Bound Traffic, CC Docket No. 99-68/ Local Competition Provisions of the Telecommunications Act of 1996, CC Docket No. 96-98; BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. Petition for Price Flexibility for Special Access and Dedicated Transport, CCB/CPD File No. 00-20 and Switched Access Services, CCB/CPD File No. 00-21.

Dear Ms. Salas:

On December 5, 2000, Robert Quinn, Steve Garavito, Frank Simone and Patrick Merrick, representing AT&T, met with Kyle Dixon, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Michael K. Powell. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss AT&T's comments in the above-captioned proceedings.

AT&T argued that pricing rules governing reciprocal compensation for local traffic should be applied on a uniform basis to both voice and ISP-bound traffic and that the Commission should declare that inter-carrier compensation for all ISP-bound traffic subject to the existing federal standard which, as applied by the states, permits bill-and-keep when traffic is in balance and otherwise requires efficient forward-looking cost-based pricing. AT&T urged the Commission to reserve its authority to order bill and keep for traffic that is the subject of the instant proceeding until it can be applied in a uniform manner across all forms of inter-carrier compensation.

In addition, AT&T urged the Commission to reject BellSouth's Pricing Flexibility Petitions for all of the reasons set forth in with our filed opposition.
