**REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME**

Pursuant to Section 1.46 of the Commission's rules, the Land Mobile Communications Council (LMCC) hereby requests an extension of time for the comment and reply comment period in the Notice of Proposed Rule Making in the above-referenced proceeding.<sup>1</sup> Specifically, the LMCC seeks an additional 60 days within which to file comments during this proceeding, and an additional 30 days within which to file reply comments.

The LMCC is a non-profit association of organizations representing virtually all users of land mobile radio systems, providers of land mobile services, and manufacturers of land mobile radio equipment. The LMCC acts with the consensus, and on behalf, of the vast majority of public safety, business, industrial, private, commercial and land transportation radio users on several frequency bands regulated by the FCC. This transfer of government spectrum has the opportunity to shape the future of America's business communications, and the LMCC and its members will be an active participant in the proceeding. However, due to the magnitude of the proceeding and its profound impact on the industries involved, as well as the need to explore the potential technologies to be deployed in these bands, we believe the Commission would be best served by extending the comment and reply comment period by 60 days and 30 days, respectively. We feel an extension will allow all interested parties ample time to supply the Commission with all encompassing comments on this proceeding.

Given the timeframe involved, we further recommend that the Commission act expeditiously on this request. We thank the Commission for the opportunity presented and look

forward to working with the Commission to shape the future of business communications through this proceeding.
