Dear Mr. Tenhula:

In the above-referenced proceeding, the Commission is considering the detariffing of international interexchange services by non-dominant interexchange carriers. We stress, as expressed in our comments, the need for a nine-month transition period before requiring mandatory detariffing given the complexities involved in the detariffing of these services. WorldCom also urges the Commission to act promptly to permit permissive detariffing so as to allow carriers, to the extent possible, to detariff their domestic and international services concurrently.
