
Re: Notification of Ex Parte Communication in WT Docket No. 99-168

Dear Ms. Salas:

This letter is to advise you, in accordance with Section 1.1206 of the FCC's rules, that on Monday, April 30, 2001, the following individuals met with FCC Commissioner Harold Furchtgott-Roth, his Senior Legal Assistant, Bryan Tramont and his Legal Advisor Ben Golant: Lowell W. Paxson and Dean Goodman of Paxson Communications Corporation; Jerry Rose of Christian Communications of Chicagoland, Inc.; Larry Ausubel of Spectrum Exchange Group; Jonathan Cohen of Wilkinson Barker Knauer, LLP; and Kenneth Salomon of Dow, Lohnes & Albertson, PLLC.

The participants discussed the substance of The Spectrum Clearing Alliance Petition for Clarification and Reconsideration as filed with the FCC on March 16, 2001 in the above-referenced docket. In particular, the participants urged the FCC (i) to adopt the band-clearing procedures as outlined in the Alliance's Petition, (ii) to postpone the 700 MHz auction until January, 2002 and (iii) to act on the Alliance's Petition by the end of May 2001. The participants advised the FCC that the Alliance now represents over 60% of the broadcasters utilizing the analog spectrum in the Channels 59-69 band.
