
On May 2, 2001, Steve Kraskin, Sylvia Lesse and John Kuykendall of Kraskin, Lesse & Cosson, LLP met with Sarah Whitesell of Commissioner Tristani's office to discuss comments filed by the Alliance of Incumbent Rural Independent Telephone Companies ("AIRIT") in the above-captioned proceeding.

The discussion included informing Ms Whitesell of AIRIT's concerns that in the absence of specific changes outlined by AIRIT (see attached list of deficiencies and proposed resolutions), the implementation of the proposal submitted by the Federal-State Joint Board's Rural Task Force (the "RTF proposal") is likely to produce results contrary to the universal service public policy and statutory mandate, including, but not limited to the discouragement of investment in rural service area infrastructure and the "gaming" of the Universal Service Fund ("USF"). The AIRIT representatives proposed that, in the event that the Commission does not amend the RTF proposal as recommended, the Commission should, prior to making any final determination: issue a Notice seeking further comment on the issues raised by AIRIT and remove the cap on USF with respect to the application of the existing rules.

In addition to the list of deficiencies and proposed resolutions, the AIRIT representatives provided Ms Whitesell with a list of AIRIT members sorted both alphabetically and by state (see attached).

Significant Rural Task Force Proposal Deficiencies and Proposed Resolutions

1. The RTF Proposal freezes USF cost recovery and converts it to a per-line basis (except for inflation factors) when a second eligible telecommunications carrier (ETC) provides service in an area served by an incumbent rural telephone company. Any USF plan that incorporates a “freeze” or “cap” is not sustainable from a legal (47 USC §254) or public policy perspective.

Resolution: Do not adopt the RTF Proposal without eliminating the freeze.

2. Under the RTF Proposal, an incumbent rural telephone company will have no opportunity to recover costs that are allocated (per the application of FCC Rules Parts 36 and 69) to interstate USF when a competitive ETC “wins” a customer. The loss of a customer does not result in equivalent loss of operating costs or required investment. When costs are allocated to USF recovery in order to achieve § 254 universal service objectives, the incumbent rural carrier cannot recover these costs from increased local or access rates.

Resolution: The RTF Proposal should be amended to provide for recovery of incumbent rural carrier costs allocated to interstate USF on a full network basis (as this is done today) and not on a “per line” basis as proposed by the RTF Proposal.

3. The RTF Proposal would award USF payments to a competitive ETC on a “per line” basis derived from the costs incurred by the incumbent rural carrier, with no relationship to the competitive ETC’s costs. The adoption of this policy will, contrary to established Commission policy, promote gaming of USF and selective competition in rural areas. Competitive carriers would be encouraged to serve the most lucrative low cost customers within a rural service area on their own facilities on the basis of the “award” incentive of obtaining USF based on the incumbent’s costs to serve both the “cream” customers and the most high cost to serve parts of the service area.

Resolution: The Commission should reject this aspect of the RTF Proposal. Where a State Commission, in accordance with its obligation to determine the public interest, designates a competitive ETC pursuant to § 214(e), the USF for the competitive ETC should be determined in accordance with the same rules and regulations applicable to the rural incumbent.

4. Increases in subscriber line charges (SLCs) assessed to rural incumbent company customers may also be under consideration in conjunction with the RTF proposal. Increases in SLCs may further impair the provision of universal service in rural telephone company areas without providing the rural customer any discernable benefit.

Resolution: The Commission should not proceed with increases in SLCs charged to rural customers in the absence of a meaningful record that demonstrates that the impact on universal service of the proposed increases has been fully considered.

In the absence of the changes in the RTF Proposal set forth above, the implementation of the proposal is likely to produce results contrary to the universal service public policy and statutory mandate, including, but not limited to the discouragement of investment in rural service area infrastructure and the “gaming “ of USF. In the event that the Commission does not amend the RTF proposal, as set forth above, the Commission should, prior to making any final determination:

1. Issue a Notice seeking further comment on the issues set forth above; and
2. Remove the cap on USF with respect to the application of the existing rules.
