This concerns your petition for rulemaking submitted January 9, 2001, which proposes that the Commission adopt a rule "to allow the DABT system, as described herein, to become one of the nation's primary national emergency alert systems[s] (EAS) and to be part of the nation's national security system."

We need additional information to determine whether your petition warrants consideration by the Commission. Please furnish the following information:


- (1) Your proposal does not include information which demonstrates its technical feasibility. Do you have any information which demonstrates the technical feasibility of your proposal? If so, please furnish it.
- (2) You propose a monopoly. Do you have any information which demonstrates that a monopoly would serve the public interest better than competition? If so, please furnish it.
- (3) Is the system you propose intended to supplement the existing emergency alert system or to replace it?
- (4) If the system you propose is intended to replace the existing system, would the proposed system provide the President of the United States with the capability to provide immediate communications and information to the general public at the National, State, and Local Area levels during periods of national emergency? If so, explain how this would be accomplished.
