COMMENTS OF DISCOVERY COMMUNICATIONS, INC.

Discovery Communications, Inc. ("DCI") files these Comments in response to the Commission's *Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking* in the captioned proceeding.

DCI is one of the nation's premier cable programmers – with a celebrated collection of established and emerging analog and digital services (the "Discovery Networks") designed to educate and inform. Despite DCI's overall success, various Discovery Networks continue to struggle to achieve and maintain critical distribution. DCI has no broadcast affiliates and is, therefore, entirely dependent on cable, DBS, and other multichannel video programming distributors to deliver the Discovery Networks to the nation's television households. As a result, DCI would be adversely affected by any regulation that artificially distorts cable carriage

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decisions and creates unwarranted government barriers to the distribution of the Discovery Networks.

I. A Dual Must Carry Requirement Would Frustrate Viewer Choice and the Development of Diverse, High Quality Programming.

DCI has no objection to competing with broadcasters for a share of the nation's television audience. Indeed, DCI has thrived, since it launched Discovery Channel in 1985, by providing programming that has consistently attracted widespread popular and critical acclaim. DCI long ago recognized that providing high quality programming of interest to the viewing public was critical to its success. The Discovery Networks have been developed consistent with that approach. In the latest EquiTrend Surveys, Discovery Channel ranked first in overall quality among the 193 media brands and 84 television networks measured.¹ Moreover, the Discovery Science Channel and The Learning Channel ranked second and third, respectively, in these same surveys. Superb results were also achieved by Animal Planet, Discovery Health Channel, and Discovery Kids, which ranked numbers 8, 9, and 14 among television networks.² Significantly, PBS was the only broadcast entity to rank within the top 10 television brands in overall quality. FOX was the top commercial broadcast entity with an 18th place ranking.

The extraordinarily high value television viewers attribute to the Discovery Networks has allowed DCI to develop and launch additional programming services. DCI is ready and eager to compete in the marketplace on the basis of merit. Unfortunately, must carry gives certain programmers preferential status, regardless of the quality or appeal of their service. Indeed, must carry has the effect of requiring cable operators to carry broadcast signals when they otherwise

would have selected another programming service. That is why broadcasters sought must carry originally and why they now seek to expand that obligation to include dual carriage.

DCI does not understand what the purported government interest is in appropriating additional cable system capacity for the duplicative transmission of broadcast programming. The unfortunate truth is that a dual carriage mandate would minimize viewer choice by reducing access to diverse, high quality services, like the Discovery Networks. This result would be a disservice to cable operators, cable programmers and, most importantly, cable customers.

II. A Dual Must Carry Requirement Would Not Pass First Amendment Review.

DCI believes that the must carry statute precludes the imposition of a dual digital/analog carriage requirement. Assuming *arguendo* the Commission is correct that the controlling statute is ambiguous on this matter,³ constitutional considerations still prohibit a dual carriage regime. The existing analog form of must carry, after all, survived Supreme Court review by only the barest of margins.⁴ The burdens associated with dual must carry dramatically shift the balance against its constitutionality. Each and every broadcaster across the country would gain access to an additional block of valuable transmission capacity without regard to the merits or appeal of its programming and without compelling evidence that this regulatory intrusion promotes any *bona fide* public interest.

The Commission was exactly right when it tentatively concluded that “a dual carriage requirement appears to burden cable operators’ First Amendment interests substantially more than is necessary to further the government’s substantial interests of [1] preserving the benefits

of free over-the-air local broadcast television, [2] promoting the widespread dissemination of information from a multiplicity of sources; and [3] promoting fair competition in the market for television programming.”⁵ Indeed, dual must carry (even if limited to a temporary phase during the ongoing analog to digital transition period) would run counter to these three objectives.

DCI appreciates the Commission’s interest in a more fully developed record. In fact, there is strikingly little evidence demonstrating how dual carriage (notwithstanding its substantial burden on cable operators, cable programmers and cable customers) would promote any of the three potential policy justifications identified in *Turner Broadcasting*. The paucity of the evidentiary record to date is telling, as the burden of proof necessarily lies with those advocating a dramatic expansion of this already troubled and tenuous First Amendment intrusion.

With regard to the first potential First Amendment justification, the broadcast industry has not in any manner demonstrated why mandating dual carriage is critical to “preserving the benefits of free over-the-air local broadcast television.”⁶ Indeed, it has not even demonstrated that the ultimate success of digital conversion is dependent on dual must carry. Surely the existing version of must carry – mandating continued carriage of each broadcast station’s analog signal – is adequate to preserve local broadcast television. Dual carriage might financially benefit broadcasters, but it is hardly necessary for their collective survival.⁷ A dual carriage

requirement would not simply preserve broadcasters' reach, but needlessly extend it, and thus would not comport with the "broadcast survival" justification identified in *Turner Broadcasting*.

With regard to the second potential First Amendment justification, the broadcasting industry certainly has not established that an expansion of must carry would promote increased diversity of programming. To the contrary, dual carriage would place additional cable system capacity under the control of established broadcasters. These broadcasters, of course, already have two government-granted routes to reach the nation's television audience (*i.e.*, directly through over-the-air transmissions and indirectly through mandated cable carriage of their analog signals). It hardly makes sense for the government to award yet another route to distribute this same programming in the name of "diversity."⁸

If the Commission were to mandate dual carriage, it would allow a single broadcaster to utilize up to 12 MHz of cable capacity to deliver a single programming service.⁹ The second 6 MHz channel requested by broadcasters could instead be used by a cable operator to provide as many as a dozen diverse programming services offered on a compressed, digital basis. This additional 6 MHz capacity lost to a single broadcaster could otherwise accommodate all of the Discovery Digital Networks¹⁰ and still leave room for other diverse programming services. Under dual must carry, channel capacity that could be used to deliver a panoply of diverse cable services instead would be devoted to redundant provision of the lowest common denominator

programming offered by the nation's broadcasters. Accordingly, the contested regulation unquestionably would be at odds with any purported "diversity" justification.

Finally, broadcasters have been unable to demonstrate how dual carriage would promote "fair competition in the market for television programming."¹¹ DCI respectfully submits that the resulting competition would be anything but fair. A broadcaster would have an automatic right to claim additional cable system capacity, without regard to the quality or appeal of its duplicative programming.

Market conditions today hardly justify an automatic doubling of each and every broadcaster's claim on cable channel capacity. Vertical integration between cable operators and cable programmers has declined significantly in recent years.¹² The dramatic growth in DBS service during this same period has further undermined any "bottleneck" concerns previously posed by the cable industry.¹³ Broadcasters may be experiencing difficulty securing additional cable channel capacity for duplicative digital and analog carriage, but there is nothing "unfair" about the competition for this limited resource. What would be unfair is to give yet another blanket carriage preference to broadcasters.

III. Channel Capacity is Still Limited

Despite DCI's overall success, securing adequate distribution has, and continues to be, a daunting challenge. As the following chart shows, many millions of existing cable customers across the country still lack access to a full range of the Discovery Networks.

Limited channel capacity contributed to DCI's decision in the late 1990s to abandon hopes of securing additional analog capacity for its newer networks and prompted DCI to launch them instead in a compressed digital format. All of these Discovery Digital Networks are today well below the 15 million distribution figure even the Commission has recognized as essential to be a viable cable network.¹⁴

The Commission should not labor under the misimpression that recent cable system upgrades and the introduction of digital compression have solved the channel shortage. If channel capacity were unlimited, broadcasters would not be requesting rules giving them preferential access, and DCI would not be concerned about additional preferential access rules for broadcasters. While cable system capacity has surely increased, so have the demands on this capacity. During carriage negotiations, cable operators have often emphasized that capacity

must be reserved for video-on-demand, streaming media, interactive television, cable modem data service, telephony, and other new applications. DCI is told that these additional communications services and revenue sources are imperative to the health of the cable industry and the nation's communications development.

If channel capacity were not still a problem, cable operators presumably would be delighted to carry all of the free broadcast programming available. Because the Discovery Networks, like most cable programming networks, require cable operators to pay a licensing fee, DCI must offer a product of sufficient appeal that a cable operator will choose to contribute both channel capacity and licensing fees to its carriage. It is telling that broadcasters ascribe so little value to their digital feed that they assume that, without federal interference, cable operators would prefer to pay for additional cable programming services rather than simply carry digital broadcast feeds for free.

When all is said and done, the reason why cable operators sometimes resist additional broadcast carriage (in favor of a Discovery Network or some other programming service) is that the broadcast product is not perceived by cable customers as adding sufficient value. This low value assessment will be exacerbated in a dual carriage scenario. For the foreseeable future, the typical television viewer subjected to dual carriage would simply see duplicate broadcasting programming and lack the equipment necessary to enjoy any HDTV benefits. As a result, dual carriage would frustrate the interests not only of cable operators and cable programmers, but cable customers.

DCI submits that the broadcast industry and its over-the-air audience ultimately would be disserved by a dual carriage regime that further insulates broadcasters from the beneficial impact

of competing on a level playing field.¹⁵ Even were that not true, a dual carriage regime is surely anathema to cable customers who have an obvious interest in maximizing their choice of quality programming. The interests of these television viewers must not be ignored, particularly when the countervailing justifications for frustrating those interests are so tenuous. As the D.C. Circuit Court of Appeals explained in striking down an earlier version of must carry:

This conscious disregard of subscribers' viewing preferences is difficult, if not impossible to reconcile with the Supreme Court's repeated admonition that the interests of viewers should be considered "paramount" in the First Amendment calculus.¹⁶

CONCLUSION

It is no surprise that certain broadcasters seek the financial security of a government-imposed dual carriage right in lieu of competing for cable system carriage on the basis of the quality or desirability of their programming. Imposing such artificial protection during this transition period would inevitably fail First Amendment scrutiny. Dual must carry would frustrate viewer choice by denying tens of millions of cable subscribers access to preferred cable networks and forcing them instead to endure duplicative transmissions of lowest common denominator broadcast fare. This First Amendment intrusion would not materially advance any of the constitutional justifications identified in *Turner Broadcasting*, but would instead affirmatively harm the viewing public. DCI is proud of the Discovery Networks and believes strongly in its right to fairly compete for cable carriage of these services. For the foregoing


