RE: Non-Broadcast Public Service Efforts

WTVE-TV 51 performed the following non-broadcast public service efforts during the Third Quarter of 1994:

1). July, August, September 1994 - WTVE-TV 51 supplies free space in its transmitter building to a local emergency ham radio group, Reading React. Reading React is a volunteer club that monitors emergency CB radio band Channel 9. They relay messages between the State Police and other agencies between the Pennsylvania Turnpike and Interstate 76. The transmitter site atop Mt. Penn gives them good coverage throughout Southeastern Pennsylvania. In addition, WTVE-TV 51 donates electrical power and antenna space on the tower 24 hours per day, 365 per year. The relationship is ongoing.

2). July, August, September 1994 - WTVE-TV 51 supplies space in the transmitter building to a volunteer ham radio club, Dauberville Ham Club, whose primary duty is to supply emergency relay communications to the Red Cross. In addition to free building space, WTVE-TV 51 donates power and an antenna mount on the tower, all free of charge, 24 hours per day, 365 days per year. This relationship is ongoing.

3). July, August, September 1994 - WTVE-TV 51 donates building space for WITF's transmitter. WITF is the PBS station out of Harrisburg. In addition to providing free space in the transmitter building, WTVE-TV 51 donates free AC power, 24 hours per day, 365 days per year. This relationship is ongoing.

4). July, August, September 1994 - Kim Bradley, WTVE-TV 51 Public Affairs Director, worked with Phyllis Watts, Administrator of Children's Rights of Pennsylvania, Inc. WTVE-TV 51 produces weekly updates entitled "In Search of Missing Children" in conjunction with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. In the segments, photographs of missing children are aired on a continuing basis.

5). July, August, September 1994 - Kim Bradley worked with Janet Dalrymple from the Kidspace National Center for Kids in Crisis regarding regular, ongoing announcements to ask families in Berks County to provide temporary homes for school children in need.

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P R O C E E D I N G S

RALPH TRAINER

was called as a witness and, having been first duly sworn by the Reporter-Notary Public, was examined and testified as follows:

BY MR. BECHTEL:

Q. Would you state, for the record, your name and residence address, please?

A. Okay. My name is Ralph S. Trainer, T-R-A-I-N-E-R, and my home address is 48 First Street, Douglassville, Pennsylvania, Zip Code, 19518.

Q. My name is Gene Bechtel. I'm counsel for Adams Communications Corporation. Mr. Hutton is counsel for Reading Broadcasting Company.

If any of my questions are confusing, please say so. If Mr. Hutton interjects before you give an answer, wait until we talk back and forth. And if you need a break, let us know.

A. Okay.

Q. Our experience today is that these things are going rather quickly.

It's my understanding that you received a Subpoena.

A. Yes.

(Whereupon, the Reporter marked Trainer

1 Exhibit No. 1 for identification, Subpoena.)

2 BY MR. BECHTEL:

3 Q. A copy of which we have marked as Exhibit 1
4 to this deposition.

5 Did you find any documents or bring them
6 with you, please?

7 A. Other than the Subpoena that I have here
8 that I received and the documents that I have before
9 me -- I'm not sure of the time table that you were
10 looking at. I highlighted some dates from my ledger.
11 One is November 14th, 1997. One is February 24th, 1995.
12 And the other documents that I have here are from a time
13 when I went out to Channel 51 by their invitation to
14 take a look at their accessibility barriers and give
15 them suggestions and so forth. That's all I have.

16 I became Executive Director. I'm going
17 into my third year. Prior to that I was an ADA
18 Coordinator, and that was my connection with Channel 51.
19 My prior Executive Director had done, with Channel 51, a
20 PSA, public service announcement, and video film of
21 that. Other than that, that's all I have.

22 Q. The documents in '97 and '95 we're not
23 interested in. The documents when you went to the
24 station to do an access evaluation, what was the time
25 period of that?

1 A. Let me see. According to the letter I have
2 here, I wrote them back thanking them for the
3 opportunity to discuss and to meet with them, that was
4 January 11th, 1995.

5 Q. We're not interested in that either.

6 A. Okay. Quite frankly, that's all my
7 documentation I have other than seeing the video that
8 was done prior to my directorship. You know, we worked
9 with them just, like I said, November 14th of '97 we did
10 another -- I guess it was a public service announcement
11 and so forth.

12 Q. What is your position?

13 A. I'm the Executive Director of Abilities in
14 Motion, and we provide services to people with
15 disabilities throughout Berks County.

16 Q. And I'm sorry, I came in here without my
17 papers.

18 A. I'll give you a brochure.

19 Q. That's great.

20 A. We don't leave home without it. Here is my
21 card and the brochure. I'll give you one, too
22 (indicating).

23 Q. Now, you have been the Executive Director
24 of this organization --

25 A. It'll be three years in January, 2000.

1 Q. I want to get back to the period of time
2 that we're dealing with which is 1989 to 1994,
3 basically.

4 A. Okay.

5 Q. Technically, it's August 1 of 1989 to
6 August 1 of 1994, but '89 to 94 kind of gets us there.

7 During that period of time, what was your
8 position with this or some other organization?

9 A. Okay. With Abilities in Motion during that
10 time I was Americans with Disabilities Act Coordinator
11 and brief ADA Coordinator and peer counselor -- that's
12 another position. What was the last years we were
13 dealing with?

14 Q. 1994.

15 A. That was it then for those two positions.
16 I went from an ADA Coordinator to a peer counselor, and
17 then eventually I moved to other positions.

18 Q. And your position was with this
19 organization?

20 A. Yes. They were formerly known as the Berks
21 County Center for Independent Living.

22 Q. And is this a government organization --

23 A. It's a non-profit --

24 Q. -- or a foundation?

25 A. It's a non-profit organization receiving

1 partial funding through the Office of Vocational
2 Rehabilitation.

3 Q. I do quite a bit of ADA work from the
4 hearing side.

5 Now, during this five-year period, 1989 to
6 1994, to your knowledge and observation, what services
7 did Channel 51, WTVE, provide to your organization?

8 A. I know they did a video of our
9 organization. It would have to be between those times
10 because I wasn't involved with it. And there were only
11 three -- I was like the fifth person hired in the
12 company so I volunteered. You could put that down, too;
13 I volunteered there before I started working there so I
14 had some knowledge of what it was they were doing.

15 But I know TV did a video highlighting of
16 our services at the time and utilizing some of the staff
17 that were there at the time and also some -- you know,
18 the consumers that they used. Fortunately for the
19 video, I wasn't in it.

20 Q. I'm sorry?

21 A. Fortunately for the video, I wasn't in it.
22 But -- and then it --

23 Q. Well, they didn't put their best foot
24 forward.

25 A. And they ran that, you know, on their, you

1

1 know, scroll that they run on TV all the time for a
2 period of time. And when they stopped -- I really don't
3 know, you know, eventually when that stopped. Like I
4 said, it was made before I actually started there, but
5 they had continued to run that for, I would say, a
6 couple period of years.

7 Q. During this period of time did you watch
8 TV?

9 A. Yes.

10 Q. What kinds of programs did you watch on TV?

11 A. I watched public TV, public channel
12 television. I also watched our regular community TV,
13 you know, and the regular stuff on commercial channels.

14 Q. Do you remember watching WTVE, Channel 51,
15 during this period of time?

16 A. Yes. And that's one of the reasons I
17 watched it, to see when they would run, you know,
18 something advertising our organization. Back then it
19 was the early days of our organization, in 1989, you
20 know. And also some of the other stuff; I believe they
21 used to have Home Shopping and probably still do. I
22 don't know. I haven't watched it in awhile because
23 we've wound up working more with Berks County Community
24 Television lately, in the last few years, but back then
25 that was my recollection.

1

1 Q. I didn't hear that part. Working more with
2 Berks --

3 A. Berks County Community TV; BCTV it's
4 called.

5 Q. What is that?

6 A. It's a local access channel station here in
7 town.

8 MR. BECHTEL: That's is all I have.

9 BY MR. HUTTON:

10 Q. Mr. Trainer, let me ask you a few follow-up
11 questions. One is, I take it during this '89 to '94
12 time period you did not have any direct interaction with
13 the staff of WTVE. Is that correct?

14 A. No.

15 Q. Apart from the work that the station did
16 with Abilities in Motion or its prior name, Berks County
17 Center for Independent Living, are you familiar with the
18 public service programming aired on WTVE during that
19 time period?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. And what areas do you recall being covered
22 besides the area in which you're employed?

23 A. Well, attendant care services through the
24 Office of Aging, I remember that being a part of your
25 programming. That was another reason why we got in

1 touch with you or vice versa in '97, to again run
2 something like that that was done before.

3 The way that program ran, someone from your
4 station pretty much did the MC'ing and someone from
5 either the Office of Aging or the community did, you
6 know, a little show about attendant care services and
7 the importance of it. That's one segment I remember.

8 Another one was -- I believe it was Wayne
9 Nervik. He's the local -- at the time was the local
10 representative of United Cerebral Palsy. He talked
11 about the Americans with Disabilities Act. That's two
12 things that stick in my mind.

13 Q. That's fair enough. That was quite awhile
14 ago. I have got a document here I'm going to have
15 introduced as Trainer Exhibit 2.

16 (Whereupon, the Reporter marked Trainer 2
17 for identification, Programs/Issues Reports.)

18 BY MR. HUTTON:

19 Q. This is a document I'm sure you've not seen
20 before. It consists of excerpts of WTVE's quarterly
21 issues and programs reports from their files for the
22 period from the fourth quarter of 1991 through the
23 fourth quarter of 1993. And if you turn to Page 3 of
24 that document, there is a description of the PSA that
25 you described, I think.

1 1 Would you say that that description is
2 accurate, to the best of your recollection?

3 A. (Witness reviewed document.)

4 Yes.

5 Q. So this was a PSA that WTVE produced?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. I'm not going to hold you to what the
8 station has listed as the times that the spot ran during
9 those years. But just flipping through, would you agree
10 that the spot appears to have run regularly on the
11 station from the fourth quarter of 1991 through the
12 first quarter of 1994, based on what you see from this
13 document?

14 MR. BECHTEL: Of course I will object to
15 that at the trial but go ahead.

16 MR. HUTTON: You will object to that?

17 MR. BECHTEL: Sure.

18 MR. HUTTON: Based on what?

19 MR. BECHTEL: Based on the fact that it
20 shows what it shows.

21 THE WITNESS: I only have up to '91,
22 12/7/91. I remember you saying in '94. I would say on
23 Page 5 --

24 MR. BECHTEL: The gentleman can answer your
25 question, but ...

1 THE WITNESS: On Page 5 I would certainly
2 say these, in all probability, are the times you ran it
3 from the periods listed on here.

4 BY MR. HUTTON:

5 Q. In other words, there's nothing
6 inconsistent here with what you recall?

7 A. Right.

8 MR. BECHTEL: I object to that because
9 you're leading the witness. He's a friendly witness to
10 you. Again, you can ask your questions.

11 BY MR. HUTTON:

12 Q. I'm trying to think of a better way to
13 formulate this. I'd like you to take a few minutes to
14 flip through the document as a whole and tell me if the
15 document is consistent or inconsistent with your best
16 recollection as to the airing of the spot by WTVE.

17 A. (Witness reviewed document.)

18 In reviewing the document, I would say that
19 it seems to be very consistent with the airing of the
20 PSA between the dates indicated in the document.

21 Q. And do you have any basis by which you
22 could compare the assistance provided by WTVE to your
23 organization during the 1989-1994 time period with the
24 assistance provided by other media outlets?

25 A. To my recollection, I don't recall during

1 my employment during this time period any priorities or
2 non-participation by any of the local medias for our
3 requests. I guess I can better state it, I don't
4 remember anyone from our staff saying that any of our
5 requests was refused by basically any of our local
6 media.

7 MR. HUTTON: I have nothing further.

8 MR. BECHTEL: Neither do I.

9 (Whereupon, the deposition concluded at
10 4:20 o'clock p.m.)



READING MUSICAL FOUNDATION

(Produced by WTVE-TV51)

This 30 second PSA produced in the previous quarter by WTVE focuses on the importance of bringing music into Berks County. It promotes their local free community calendar which includes such events as music in the schools, senior citizens concerts, public concerts, scholarships and the Reading Symphony Orchestra.

BERKS COUNTY CENTER FOR INDEPENDENT LIVING

The B.C.C.I.L. is a 30 second PSA which WTVE produced in October is funded by the Vocational Rehabilitation of Department of Labor and Industry of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. This program also supplies activities for the members to participate in.
