Dear Secretary Salas:

On June 18, 2001, ArrayComm, Inc. (hereinafter ArrayComm), met with Lauren Maxim Van Wager, legal assistant to Commissioner Michael Copps regarding the above-referenced proceeding. Nitin Shah, Bradley Holmes, Randall Coleman and Leonard Kolsky represented ArrayComm.

Mr. Shah described the iBURST system, emphasizing its spectrum efficiency and the public need for a high-speed portable data system to transmit into the Internet. The iBURST system is not designed to be competitive with 3G systems but rather to complement them.

We expressed concern that if 1670-1675 MHz were auctioned on other than a nation-wide basis, ArrayComm's business plans would be jeopardized and potential investors might be discouraged. We noted that those who had expressed interest in this band also favored a nation-wide auction. Thus, the record on this point was unanimous.


The comments to the Commission's forthcoming Public Notice might give rise to opposite views but at this stage the Commission should tilt toward the adoption of a nation-wide auction.

We also urged that the Commission hold this auction as early as possible, certainly within the first quarter of 2002.
