PETITION FOR RULE MAKING

Rocky III Investments, Inc. ("Petitioner"), is the licensee of FM radio broadcast station KRYD, operating on Channel 285C1, at Telluride, Colorado. By its attorneys and pursuant to Section 1.420 of the Commission's Rules, Petitioner hereby requests the Commission to amend Section 73.202(b) of its Rules to change the allotment of Channel 285C1 from Telluride, Colorado, to Norwood, Colorado, and to modify the license of KRYD accordingly.

The proposed allotment to Norwood will result in a preferential arrangement of FM channel allotments. Norwood satisfies all FCC criteria necessary to receive an award of this frequency. Not only is Norwood clearly a "community" for allotment purposes, but the proposed allotment would supply Norwood with its first local aural transmission service.

"Generally, if a community is incorporated or is listed in the U.S. Census, that is sufficient to demonstrate its status [as a community for allotment purposes]." *Arnoldsburg, West Virginia*, 15 FCC Rcd 9210, ¶6 (MMB 2000). Both of these requirements are met here.

Norwood has been incorporated as a town in San Miguel County, Colorado, since June 9, 1905.¹ The U.S. Census Bureau lists the town of Norwood with a population of 438 residents.² Admittedly, the population within the city limits of Norwood is relatively small. However, a small population is not a bar to community status. The Commission has on numerous occasions concluded that communities of the same size as Norwood or with even smaller populations can be allotted channels for FM radio service. *See, e.g., Eva, Alabama*, 7 FCC Rcd 5489, ¶5-7 (MMB 1992); *Arnoldsburg, West Virginia, supra*.

This is not a case where the proposed community is a mere suburb of a larger town. Rather, there is no community with more than a thousand residents within thirty miles of Norwood. Norwood is the central point in a large rural area that views Norwood as its “town.” Similar considerations have supported earlier FCC decisions approving the allotment of FM channels to small towns in isolated areas.

Numerous other factors support a determination that Norwood is a community deserving of its own radio station. A mayor and five-member town council govern Norwood. The community boasts its own Town Hall, and the Town provides its residents with water and sewer services.³ The Town’s residents enjoy public services provided by the Norwood Public Library

and the Norwood elementary, middle, and high schools. *Id.* In addition, Norwood has its own Post Office maintained by the U.S. Postal Service.

As a further indication of community status, a local religious organization is known as the "Norwood Southern Baptist Church." Inclusion of the town's name in the name of such institution indicates that it is intended to serve residents of a community rather than mere transients. *See Semora, North Carolina, 5 FCC Rcd 934 (1990).*

Norwood has its own local newspaper, the *Norwood Post*. Residents are also served by a number of commercial enterprises located in Norwood and identified with the community. These include the Norwood Inn, Norwood Liquor Store, and Norwood True Value & Commercial Supply.⁴ Among other businesses are eating establishments such as Karen's Restaurant and the Lone Cone Restaurant & Bar. In view of these economic, religious and cultural factors, Norwood should be treated as a community for allotment purposes.

There are no AM or FM broadcast stations -- either commercial or non-commercial -- currently licensed to Norwood. Consequently, as noted at the outset, the proposed reallocation of Channel 285C1 to Norwood, Colorado, will constitute that community's first local transmission service.

As indicated in the Technical Statement attached as Exhibit A, the proposed allotment of Channel 285C1 at Norwood is mutually exclusive with the current authorization for that frequency at Telluride. Commission approval of a plan to move an FM channel from one com-

munity to another generally requires that the Commission's allotment priorities favor the new community. *Modification of FM and TV Authorizations to Specify a New Community of License*, 4 FCC Rcd 4870, 4874 (1989), *recon. granted in part*, 5 FCC Rcd 7094 (1990).

The proposed reallocation will serve the Commission's allotment priorities and the public interest, even though Telluride, Colorado, with 2,221 residents,⁵ is the larger of the two communities. Under the Commission's allotment criteria, a first local transmission service is distinctly preferred over provision of multiple local service, even where the community with more services is much larger. *See Revision of FM Assignment Policies and Procedures*, 90 FCC 2d 88, ¶11, 51 RR 2d 807 (1982), *recon. denied* 56 RR 2d 448; *cf. Middlebury, Berlin and Hardwick, Vermont*, 15 FCC Rcd 131 (MMB 2000).

In this instance, plans proposed by Petitioner will not deprive any community of its first local transmission service as the result of the proposed change. Telluride will continue to receive adequate local service from noncommercial educational FM station KOTO. In addition, Broadcasting for the Challenged, Inc., has applied for a construction permit that will authorize an additional FM service for Telluride on Channel 214.⁶ Norwood is therefore preferred over Telluride, given that Telluride will retain its other existing aural services.

KRYD would itself continue to provide reception service to those who receive its signal from Telluride now.⁷ Although Petitioner has identified an “allotment reference site” in order to satisfy all spacing requirements for this allotment change, the actual transmitter site of KRYD will remain at the current site. That location was originally authorized pursuant to §73.215 of the Rules, and under §73.215 the transmitter of a station licensed to Norwood may also be located there. *See* Exhibit A at 2 n. 2.

Significantly, the contemplated reallocation will not remove service from a rural area to serve an urban area. KRYD will not provide a 70 dBu signal to 50 percent or more of any urbanized area, since no part of the service area is located within an urbanized area. Norwood is not a suburb of any larger community, but rather is an independent community that deserves its own local radio station. The nearest community claiming a more significant population than Norwood or Telluride is Montrose, Colorado, population 12,344.⁸ Both Telluride and Norwood are many miles by road from Montrose, and these towns are separated from Montrose by mountains and vast open areas. Moreover, Norwood has its own independent history and institutions.⁹ Thus, Norwood qualifies as an independent community deserving of its own radio outlet in the public interest.¹⁰


If the Commission grants the instant proposal to reallocate Channel 285C1 to Norwood, Colorado, then Petitioner will file an application to modify its license to specify operations in Norwood on Channel 285C1.

In view of the foregoing, Petitioner's proposal is in compliance with all Commission requirements for the suggested change. Accordingly, Petitioner respectfully requests that the Commission amend its Table of Allotments, 47 C.F.R. §73.202(b), to change the allotment of Channel 285C1 at Telluride, Colorado, to Channel 285C1 at Norwood, Colorado, as follows:

TECHNICAL STATEMENT

1. This technical statement and attached exhibits were prepared on behalf of Rocky III Investments, Inc. ("Rocky III), licensee of station KRYD, Channel 285C1, Telluride, Colorado. Rocky III herein request that Channel 285C1 be re-allotted from Telluride, Colorado to Norwood, Colorado. The change in community of license will provide Norwood with it first locally licensable FM channel without depriving Telluride of its only local service.

REQUEST

2. Norwood, Colorado, incorporated in 1905, is located in the north central portion of San Miguel County, Colorado. Norwood has a population of 438 persons based on the recently released 2000 U.S. Census. Norwood is governed by a mayor and five member town council. The municipality provides water, sewer and police services to its residents. There is also a volunteer Fire Department. There are numerous business, residential and recreational areas in Norwood. Norwood is also the home of Norwood High School, Norwood Middle School and Norwood Elementary School.¹ Based on this information, Norwood is believed to be a community for allocation purposes.

3. Channel 285C1 can be allocated to Norwood, Colorado, at reference coordinates North Latitude 38° 00' 05" and West Longitude 107° 57' 53". This represents a site restriction of

34.6 kilometers east-southeast of the community.² Attached as Exhibit #1 is a map depicting where Channel 285C1 can be located and meet the Commission’s minimum distance separation requirements. Exhibit #2 is a §73.207 spacing study from the proposed reference site which confirms Channel 285C1 meets the Commission’s spacing rules to all licensed, applied for or proposed facilities.³ From the proposed reference site, a signal of at least 3.16 mV/m (50/50) in intensity will be delivered to all of Norwood.

4. Therefore, Rocky III proposes the following amendment to §73.202(b) of the rules:



- 2) The proposed reference site is located 0.37 kilometer from the authorized KRYD site. The KRYD site cannot be specified as the allocation site, due to shortages to three applications for Channel 287A at Durango, Colorado. The KRYD authorization was granted pursuant to §73.215. However, due to the terrain conditions in this area of Colorado, locating the reference site in the community of Norwood would not allow for the maximization of service of a theoretical C1 facility, due to the requirement for an extremely tall tower. It is the intention of Rocky III, upon the re-allotment of Channel 285C1 to Norwood, to file FCC Form 301 and specify the existing KRYD site. The proposed allocation site meets the Commission’s minimum distance separation requirements of §73.207.
 - 3) The exhibit shows a shortage of 0.46 kilometer to two of the applications for Channel 287A at Durango and a 0.30 kilometer shortage to one other Durango applicant. However, these distances round to zero under §73.208 of the rules. Therefore, Channel 285C1 is fully spaced to the Durango applicants.
 - 4) While Channel 219C3 is a non-commercial channel not listed in §73.202, it is shown for reporting purposes.

PUBLIC INTEREST ASPECTS

5. The proposed allotment of Channel 285C1 to Norwood, Colorado, will provide the community with its first locally licensable FM channel, without depriving Telluride of its only service. Further, the proposed re-allotment will not be relocating the station from a rural to an urbanized area.⁶ A maximum Class C1 facility operating from the proposed reference site, will provide service to 49,679 persons in 16,376.5 square kilometers.⁷ Once Channel 285C1 is allotted to Norwood, Rocky III will file an application for minor change to specify Norwood, Colorado, as its community of license.⁸

6. The forgoing was prepared on behalf of Rocky III Investments, Inc., by Graham Brock, Inc., its Technical Consultants. All data related to FM facilities was extracted from the CDDBS database, as updated on June 8, 2001. We assume no liability for errors or omissions in that database which may be adverse to the requests contained herein. All census data is U.S. Census of 2000.

- 6) The closest Urbanized area to this proposal is Grand Junction, Colorado, which is located more than 130 kilometers from the proposed reference site.
- 7) Based on a maximum Class C1 radius of 72.2 kilometers, assuming uniform terrain. As indicated previously, once Channel 285C1 is allotted to Norwood, Colorado, Rocky III intends to propose the present KRYD licensed facilities in an application to the Commission.
- 8) The application will propose the currently licensed KRYD transmitter site.




USABLE AREA MAP



DECLARATION OF RALPH WEAVER, MAYOR OF NORWOOD, COLORADO

My name is Ralph Weaver. I serve as mayor in the town of Norwood, Colorado. I would like to attest to certain facts relating to a proposal by Rocky III Investments, Inc., to change the city of license of FM radio station KRYD from Telluride, Colorado, to Norwood.

I understand that, when the Federal Communications Commission receives a proposal in which a broadcaster desires to establish a community's first local FM station, the Commission examines various criteria to determine whether the location of the proposed station is, indeed, a community. Norwood definitely should satisfy the Commission's criteria.


First, the town traces its roots to 1879, when the area was first homesteaded. Shortly thereafter, businesses were set up here to supply ranchers herding cattle from the Paradox Valley on their way to the Lone Cone pastures. Norwood was incorporated as a town in 1905. Today, the town is a center for outdoor recreational activities.

Norwood is listed in the latest U.S. Census with a population of more than 400 residents -- 438, to be exact. The Town Council and I (as Norwood's Mayor) operate out of the Norwood Town Hall. The town of Norwood provides water and sewer services and maintains a public library. Norwood has its own school system, from elementary through high school. Norwood also hosts a Post Office. Our own newspaper, the *Norwood Post*, is published here.

Norwood's identity as a community is reinforced by the common use of the town's name to identify its private institutions. For example, local members of the Southern Baptist religious denomination attend services at the Norwood Southern Baptist Church.

Many businesses, such as Rocking "R" Restaurant and the Lone Cone Restaurant & Bar, are proud to call Norwood their home. However, several local businesses -- such as the Norwood Inn, Norwood Liquor Store, and Norwood True Value & Commercial Supply -- are particularly noteworthy to the Commission's deliberations because the name "Norwood" appears in their names.




The Colorado State Archives has custody of the incorporation records for cities and towns covering the period 1878 through 1977. The more recent municipal incorporation records are housed at the Office of the Secretary of State. While these records are inherently important to the historical foundation of our State, they also can provide the researcher with genealogical and legal documentation. Municipal incorporation records often have plat and city plan maps as well as charters. Occasionally codes and ordinances, court transcripts, and annexation documentation exist. Furthermore, these records may include voting records and poll books, which provide the names of those living in the prospective town and its "founding fathers". Below is an unabridged list of the cities and town incorporation records deposited at the Colorado State Archives. Included in this list is the municipality's county location and its incorporation date. Address all **documented** corrections, additions, and comments to the Colorado State Archives.
