

Dear Ms. Salas:

On July 19, 2001, Mike Chartier of Intel Corp.; Ken Riordan of Motorola, Inc.; Dick Shrum of IIT Research Institute; and Scott Harris and myself of Harris, Wiltshire & Grannis LLP met with Lauren Van Wazer, Interim Legal Advisor to Commissioner Michael J. Copps, to discuss the state of software defined radio (SDR) technology, the implications of handheld wireless devices that can be reprogrammed in the field, and the anticipated benefits of SDR's deployment, including over-the-air equipment upgrades and bug fixes. We also discussed the commercial, military, and international aspects of the SDR Forum, and the progress that the SDR Forum is making in developing security and authentication technologies that will enable software defined radio (SDR) devices to operate securely and safely, avoiding either negligent or malicious changes that would cause unauthorized operations.
