This letter is being filed on behalf Motorola, Inc. On August 1, 2001. Dennis Roberson, Senior Vice President and Chief Technology Officer, Motorola, and John Lyons, Director, Telecommunications Strategy and Regulation, Motorola, met with Commissioner Gloria Tristani and Senior Legal Advisor Adam Krinsky. Mr. Roberson and Mr. Lyons also met with Bruce Franca, Acting Chief, Office of Engineering and Technology, Julius Knapp, Deputy Chief of OET, and Kent Nilsson, Deputy Chief, Network Technology Division (OET).

On the same day, Michael Kennedy, Corporate Vice President and Director of Government Relations, Motorola, joined Mr. Roberson and Mr. Lyons for separate meetings with Commissioner Kevin Martin and Legal Advisor Monica DeSai; Commissioner Michael Copps and Legal Advisor Lauren Van Wazer; and Commissioner Kathleen Abernathy and Senior Legal Advisor Bryan Tramont.

During each of the above listed meetings, part of the time was devoted to a discussion of the Commission's rulemaking proceeding to allocate the spectrum found at 4.94 – 4.99 GHz. The Motorola representatives noted how more than 95 individual public safety organizations and all of the major associations representing public safety have strongly recommended that the Commission allocate this spectrum to public safety for the provision of broadband wireless services. The Motorola representatives stated that Motorola is strongly supporting the public safety community in its effort to obtain the allocation of this spectrum and urged that the allocation be made to public safety as soon as possible, preferably in September 2001.
