**Revision of the Commission's Rules to Ensure Compatibility with Enhanced
911 Emergency Calling Systems**

Dear Ms. Salas:

In response to a request from the staff of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, we are providing the attached information regarding AT&T Wireless Services Inc.'s ("AWS's") deployment of Phase I E911 service to customers nationwide as of August 20, 2001. As the attached information demonstrates, AWS has worked cooperatively with its PSAP partners to speed the deployment of E911 services.

We have organized the requested information into four categories: activated, in progress, pending PSAP response, and on hold.^{1/} The first category -- "activated PSAPs" -- includes all jurisdictions where Phase I service is fully deployed, and represents more than 2 million AWS customers nationwide. AWS is using an NCAS solution in each of these jurisdictions. The second category of PSAP -- those that are "in progress" -- includes all PSAP jurisdictions where Phase I service is in the process of being deployed. Deployment usually takes place within 120 days from the date the PSAP signs a service agreement.

^{1/} AWS has not included in the attached list any requests from PSAPs in jurisdictions where it does not provide service or any of the requests to which it responded but was informed that the request was "informational" only.

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The third category -- "pending PSAP response" -- includes all jurisdictions where AWS has received a request for Phase I service but needs additional information from the PSAP or a signature on a service agreement before it can proceed. The final category -- "on hold" PSAPs -- is composed of a small number of PSAPs that are no longer in the pending category because they did not respond to repeated requests for information from AWS. After failing to receive any feedback from these PSAPs, AWS sent them a letter notifying them that deployment activity for their jurisdiction would be placed on hold until AWS received further information from them.
