By the Accounting Policy Division, Common Carrier Bureau:

1. The Accounting Policy Division (Division) has under consideration the above-captioned Requests for Review of decisions issued by the Schools and Libraries Division (SLD) of the Universal Service Administrative Company.¹ These requests seek review of SLD decisions pursuant to section 54.719(c) of the Commission's rules.²

2. The Commission's rules provide that the Common Carrier Bureau (Bureau) must issue a decision resolving a request for review of matters properly before it within ninety days unless the time period is extended.³ The Bureau requires additional time to review the issues presented. Accordingly, we extend by an additional sixty (60) days the deadline by which the Bureau must take action regarding the instant Requests for Review of decisions by the Schools and Libraries Division.

3. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED, pursuant to section 54.724(a) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 54.724(a), that the time period for taking action in the above-captioned Requests for Review IS EXTENDED BY an additional sixty days to November 19, 2001, for the Request for Review filed by Alameda County Office of Education, Hayward, California; to November 13, 2001, for the Request for Review filed by Intelnet Commission, Indianapolis, Indiana; to November 28, 2001, for the Request for Review filed by Marysville Public Schools, Marysville, Michigan; to November 27, 2001, for the Request for Review filed by Molalla River School District, Molalla, Oregon; to November 27, 2001, for the Request for Review filed by Sandhills Technology/Telecommunications Educational Project, Merna, Nebraska; to November 5, 2001, for the Request for Review filed by Southwest Virginia Education and Training
