**REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME**

The Cellular Telecommunications & Internet Association ("CTIA")<sup>1/</sup> respectfully requests a ten-day extension of time – from October 11, 2001 to October 21, 2001 – in which to submit comments in the above-captioned proceeding.<sup>2/</sup>

<sup>1/</sup> CTIA is the international organization of the wireless communications industry for both wireless carriers and manufacturers. Membership in the association covers all Commercial Mobile Radio Service ("CMRS") providers and manufacturers. CTIA represents more broadband PCS carriers and more cellular carriers than any other trade association.

<sup>2/</sup> CTIA is concurrently requesting a two week extension of time to file comments in another proceeding, the due date of which currently is also October 11, 2001. The spectrum allocation issues raised in this docket remain of critical importance to CTIA's members. However, wireless carriers across the nation have had to reorder their priorities in order to respond to the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. These activities have made it difficult for them to devote the time and personnel required to prepare comments in this proceeding. The events of September 11 also require all interested parties to reassess their positions on spectrum use to ensure that they appropriately balance public and private needs.

Grant of this request would be in the public interest because it would give commenters sufficient time in which to address the important issues raised in the rulemaking proceeding and would provide the Commission with a more complete record on which to base its decision.
