Dear Chairman Powell:

I am very pleased to transmit the attached press release describing the agreement recently reached between TruePosition and Movistar Puerto Rico, a joint venture between ClearComm and Telefonica Moviles of Spain, to deploy TruePosition's network-based ALI solution in Movistar's CDMA/AMPS markets. E911 service is a life-saving application and one of the most important wireless location services to be provided to the consumer. More and more emergency calls are received by 911 call centers from wireless phones, with more than 120,000 calls per day (representing approximately 1/3 of all 911 calls). Movistar to deploy TruePosition® Wireless Location System™
