

PETITION FOR RULE MAKING

Pursuant to 47 C.F.R. 1.401, Linda Crawford respectfully petitions the FCC to institute a Rule Making proceeding to amend the FM Table of Allotments to add Channel 276C3 at Roaring Springs, Texas.

DISCUSSION

Petitioner respectfully submits that the public interest would be served by allocating Channel 276C3 to Roaring Springs, Texas, as that community's first aural broadcast transmission service. Roaring Springs is an incorporated city with a population of 213 people as of January 1, 1998 according to the Texas State Data Center. Roaring Springs has its own mayor, Joe Thacker, Jr., its own post office, its own volunteer fire department and its own city hall.


