

PETITION FOR RULE MAKING

Pursuant to 47 C.F.R. 1.401, Katherine Pyeatt respectfully petitions the FCC to institute a Rule Making proceeding to amend the FM Table of Allotments to add Channel 231A at San Isidro, Texas, as that community's First aural broadcast transmission service.

DISCUSSION

Petitioner respectfully submits that the public interest would be served by allocating Channel 231A to San Isidro, Texas as that community's first aural broadcast transmission service.

San Isidro is a Census Designated Place (CDP) with a population of 160 people according to the Texas State Data Center estimates of January 1, 1998. San Isidro has its own post office, its own school system, the San Isidro Independent Schools, its own volunteer fire department, its own city commissioner, Abel Gonzalez and a number of local churches.

The proposed channel 231A will provide additional diversity and an outlet for local self-expression to San Isidro residents and therefore is in the public interest.

Attached hereto is a channel study confirming that Channel 231A can be allocated to San Isidro, Texas consistent with the FCC's FM separation rules. See revision of FM Assignment Policies and Procedures, 90 FCC 2d 88 (1992).


