Dear Ms. Salas:

This letter confirms the telephone discussions between Elizabeth Nightingale of the International Bureau and me that took place on December 7 and December 11, 2000. In these discussions, Ms. Nightingale confirmed that SBC Communications Inc. ("SBC") already has the authority to transfer control of the international Section 214 authorization held by CCPR of the Virgin Islands ("CCPR - VI") (File No. ITC-214-20001101-00664), to Cingular Wireless LLC ("Cingular") without filing a further application.

SBC applied to transfer control of the wireless licenses held by CCPR - VI (see ULS File No. 0000117851) along with other wireless and international Section 214 authorizations held by various SBC subsidiaries and affiliates to Cingular (formerly known as Alloy LLC) on May 5, 2000. As part of these applications, SBC requested approval for the transfer of any after-acquired authorizations, including "any authorization issued to SBC's . . . subsidiaries and affiliates during . . . the period required for consummation of the transaction following approval."¹ On September 29,

2000, the Wireless Telecommunications and International Bureaus granted consent to these transfer of control applications.²

While SBC, BellSouth Corporation and Cingular consummated most of the transfers of control on October 2, 2000, they have not yet consummated with respect to the "CCPR family" of companies, including CCPR – VI. Thus, Ms. Nightingale informed me that the International Bureau has concluded that CCPR – VI's new international Section 214 authorization qualifies as an after-acquired authorization and may be transferred to Cingular without further Commission action.
