Dear Secretary Salas:

On behalf the American Library Association, the oldest and largest library association in the world with some 64,000 members, I respectfully submit two extremely qualified candidates for the Universal Service Administrative Company Board of Directors. Both Anne Campbell, the director of the National City Public Library in California, and Nancy Bolt, State Librarian for the Colorado State Library, are superb candidates for the USAC director who represents the library community. K.G. Ouye, stepping down after several years of distinguished service, formerly held this position.

Both Ms. Campbell and Ms. Bolt have been community leaders and participants in the E-rate program. They would bring different perspectives and different assets to the USAC Board. Either of these candidates is capable of continuing the strong leadership Ms. Ouye has provided for the E-rate program.

Anne Campbell has served as director of the National City Public Library System for nine years. Ms. Campbell has successfully integrated the E-rate program into resource and outreach development, elevating the level of technology services available to her public. 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

Nancy Bolt plays a key leadership role in the E-rate program both in Colorado and on a national level. Ms. Bolt has been an active and highly respected member of the American Library Association, having served on the association's Executive Board. She is currently the chair of the Colorado Library Association Bulgarian Library Project Committee and has been a member of ALA's International Relations Committee.

Ms. Campbell and Ms. Bolt both are strong advocates for the promise and benefit of the E-Rate Program. We respectfully request that you approve one of these library leaders to work with the Schools and Libraries Division of USAC to encourage continued streamlining and accountability so vital to the program's success.
