Dear Ms. Salas:

On behalf of my client QUALCOMM Incorporated ("QUALCOMM"), this is to report that today, Jonas Neihardt, QUALCOMM's Vice President for Federal Affairs, met with Paul Margie, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Michael J. Copps for Spectrum and International Matters to discuss topics related to the above-referenced proceeding.

In this meeting, Mr. Neihardt reiterated QUALCOMM's strong support for the pending waiver requests filed by Verizon Wireless, Sprint PCS, ALLTEL, Qwest Wireless, and Leap Wireless, all of whom are deploying assisted GPS, the most highly accurate and precise position location technology available, but need additional time to complete the deployment in light of the schedules of infrastructure and handset vendors. Mr. Neihardt also reiterated QUALCOMM's opposition to the requests by AT&T and Cingular for waivers of the FCC's accuracy rules, the rules which are designed to give public safety entities the level of accuracy they need to protect the public. Mr. Neihardt explained that the record demonstrates that the E-OTD technology is defective and will not produce the accuracy required by the Commission's rules.
