Dear Mr. Pohorilak:

Reference is made to your July 31, 2001 letter requesting Region 30 concurrence with the Region 19 revised Window 8 allotments.

Region 30 has considered the proposed allotments and will accept this version of your Window 8 allotments. However, we must note that in order to give concurrence we had to remove 3 channel allotments that Region 30's Regional Plan Update Committee had previously approved for New York State's Statewide Wireless Network on July 11, 2001. The Region 30 Plan's revised table of allotments is being sent to you under separate cover for inter-regional concurrence.

Because of concurrent activity in New York State to develop a statewide wireless network for all agencies, it is important for prospective applicants to break from the traditional design approach of large coverage mountain top noise limited designs and move toward low profile interference limited designs where a high degree of frequency re-use can be obtained. New York State has developed a sophisticated software application that can very tightly pack channels resulting in a high re-use factor if the site coverage is designed in this manner.

Region 30 concurs with Region 19's Window 8 proposed channel allotments as listed on the attached spreadsheet.
