

On October 5, 2001, Paul Ludwick, Senior Product Manager for Sprint met via video teleconferencing with the following staff members of the Consumer Information Bureau (CIB): Sean White, Greg Hlibok, Janet Sievert and Helen Chang. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss additional services that the Commission may seek to require be provided to TRS users. These services were TTY Interrupt Capability; Caller ID; Return Call/Call Back (*69); Speed Dial; Last Number Redial; Call Release; Three Way Calling; Call Blocking; and, V.18 TTY standard. The discussion centered on the challenges that would have to be overcome by TRS providers if they were to offer these services.
