Dear Ms. Salas:

This letter is being filed on behalf Motorola, Inc. On November 5, 2001, Richard Barth, Vice President and Director, Telecommunications Strategy, and John Lyons, Director, Telecommunications Strategy and Regulation, met with Marsha MacBride, Chief of Staff, and Peter Tenhula, Senior Legal Advisor, Office of Chairman Powell.

The meeting was devoted to a discussion of homeland security and the Commission's future plans relating to this issue. During the discussion, the Motorola representatives made brief reference to the Commission's rulemaking proceeding to allocate the spectrum found at 4.94 – 4.99 GHz. Mr. Barth noted the broad public safety support for the Commission allocating this spectrum to public safety for the provision of broadband wireless services and pointed out that this impending decision is very relevant to the national homeland security requirements. He reiterated a previously expressed Motorola position that the allocation should be made to public safety as soon as possible, preferably before yearend 2001.
