In support of this PETITION FOR RULE MAKING
proposing allotment of FM Channel 244C3 (96.7 MHz)
to Boscobel, Starboard respectfully submits an Engineering
Statement prepared by Lyle Robert Evans, Technical
Consultant, attached hereto as Appendix I.

Inasmuch as Boscobel and vicinity residents shall
be provided a First Local Broadcast Service, Starboard

concludes this Proposed Rule Making in the Public Interest.

Boscobel, Wisconsin, population 3,047 persons per the 2000 Census; in Grant County, population 49,597 persons per the 2000 Census, is an incorporated city and therefore a bona fide community for allotment purposes. (Please see Attachment A "Boscobel, Wisconsin; A Community Profile").

The proposed FM Channel 244C3 allotment shall provide residents of Boscobel, Wisconsin and vicinity a first broadcast service and an outlet for local self-expression.

Allotment of FM channel 244C3 to Boscobel is in full accord with all applicable Commission Rules, Regulations and Assignment policy.

If the Commission goes forward to Amend 47 Code of Federal Regulations §73.202(b), to allot FM Channel 244C3 at Boscobel, Starboard shall immediately file an Application For Construction Permit For Commercial Broadcast Station (FCC Form 301), to activate FM Channel 244C3 as allotted.

Upon Commission "Grant" of such a Form 301 Application, Starboard shall promptly construct, operate and subsequently license the permitted facility.

In accord with 47 Code of Federal Regulations §1.52, I, Stephen (no middle initial) Gajdosik, Vice-President and a Director of Starboard Broadcasting, Inc., certify: To the best of my knowledge, information and

STARBOARD PRESENTS THIS BOSCOBEL, WISCONSIN COMMUNITY PROFILE, TO EVIDENCE BOSCOBEL IS A BONA FIDE COMMUNITY FOR ALLOTMENT PURPOSES.

BOSCOBEL, WISCONSIN IS AN INCORPORATED CITY WITH A POPULATION OF 3,047 PERSONS PER THE 2000 CENSUS. BOSCOBEL'S POPULATION INCREASED DRAMATICALLY IN THE PAST DECADE EXCEEDING AN 11 PERCENT GROWTH RATE.

BOSCOBEL HAS ITS OWN UNITED STATES POST OFFICE AND ZIP CODE 53805.





Kronshage Park

The city has ten public parks, including 30-acre Kronshage Park, which has an Olympic-size swimming pool, a basketball court, a volleyball court, five tennis courts, four shelters, and many picnic tables and outdoor grills. All amenities are open to the public, although there is a \$20 fee to reserve use of park shelters (Gene Larsen Memorial Shelter is \$40) for private affairs such as family reunions. Hickory Grove Golf Course, just eight miles south on Highway 61, is open to the public.

During the winter months the city operates a municipal skating rink. The community offers a diverse range of food and lodging establishments. Whether it's the "drive-through" mode of fast food or affordable home-style cooking, Boscobel can suit the traveler's budget and the visitor's palate. A recreation area on the banks of the Wisconsin River offers a picnic area, as well as access to the river by an asphalt landing. The area features restrooms, a telephone and ample parking.

GENERAL INFORMATION

SCHOOL BOARD

The Board of Education is comprised of seven members elected at large by the voters for three year terms. Regular meetings are held on the 3rd Tuesday of the month at 8:00 PM in the District Office Board Room. The public is invited to attend the meetings.

PHILOSOPHY

The Boscobel Area School District is committed to a philosophy of service to children. The objective is to help each child develop as a member of society. The school district believes that this objective can best be met through the development of school programs based upon the intellectual, physical, civic, social, emotional and aesthetic needs of children. We believe our school should keep abreast of the times in all areas of instruction in order to offer a dynamic educational program by adopting and applying new knowledge and technology in the improvement of education, interpreting social change, helping youth prepare for life and exhibit leadership.

To meet this end, the overall educational program should be a cooperative venture of the pupils, parents, teachers, administrators and Board of Education.

SCHOOL POLICIES

Copies of school district policies are available at each school office. The school calendar, handbooks, newsletters and other pertinent information about the school and the district are available upon request at the building offices.

SCHOOL STAFF

The Boscobel Area School District employs 145 individuals. There are 89 teachers who are certified by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction and 56 support personnel.

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation is provided to students who live outside the city limits or reside in areas deemed hazardous. Students who reside within the District boundaries will receive bus transportation if they live two miles or beyond from their school of attendance. Special education students whose IEP recommends transportation will be transported by the District. Students in special education will be picked up at their residence and other students will be expected to walk to a designed bus stop. Students with short term ailments, supported by a doctor's requirements, will be transported for a limited time period.

LUNCH PROGRAMS

The schools provide a hot lunch prepared at the central kitchen at a cost set by the Board of Education. There are free and reduced priced meals available to students who qualify. Forms may be picked up at each school. Students may bring a lunch from home if they wish. Milk is available for a nominal price and morning a la carte is available in the high school/middle school and elementary buildings.

PUPIL SERVICES

Pupil services personnel include a director/psychologist, exceptional education teachers, guidance, speech and nurse. The following in-district programs provide for students with exceptional education needs.

Boscobel participates in cooperative programs in other districts in order to provide services for EEN and at-risk students.

REGISTRATION

PLEASE REGISTER YOUR CHILDREN AS SOON AS POSSIBLE UPON MOVING TO BOSCOBEL. This will facilitate enrollment procedures and transfer of records. Students in grades 7-12 register at the high school and PreK-6 students at the elementary school.

KINDERGARTEN ENTRANCE AGE

Students must be five years old on or before September 1 of the year in which they enroll for school. There is an early admission to kindergarten policy and parents interested in pursuing an early admittance should contact the elementary building principal office at 375-4165.

HIGH SCHOOL

Boscobel High School uses the Block 8 Schedule where students are in 4 classes per day for 85 minutes in length. If you have questions regarding credits, early graduation, specific courses, or schedules, please contact the high school counselor at 375-4161.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The commencement exercise is considered an honor and only students who have successfully completed all requirements and obligations prescribed by the School Board will be eligible for a diploma. If you have any questions regarding graduation, credits, scholarships, or transcripts please contact the high school counselor at 375-4161.

Credits for graduation are phased in sequentially to accommodate the Block 8 schedule as follows:

Grade 12	25 credits
Grade 11	27 credits
Grade 10	28 credits
Grade 9	28 credits

A credit represents one (1) 85 minute period that meets every other day for one (1) school year. Physical education is required for three years and yields 1/2 credit per year. The following are the minimum requirements for graduation but do not guarantee college admission:

Science	3 credits
Health	.5 credits

Students are expected to be enrolled in 8 periods of coursework/workstudy.


