On 11 December 2001, Dick Allen of Apple, Inc., and Damon Ladson and Scott Blake Harris of Harris, Wiltshire & Grannis LLP met in the above-noted matter with Julius Knapp and Neal McNeil of the Office of Engineering and Technology.

During this meeting, Apple strongly supported the Commission's basic proposals in this docket; urged that the Commission bring this proceeding to a prompt conclusion; suggested that the Commission accept some form of intelligent (or coordinated) adaptive hopping in the band; suggested that making adaptive hopping mandatory might make sense in certain situations (e.g., for those who take advantage of the reduced hopsets that the Commission has proposed to permit); and reiterated its view that that the power spectral density levels proposed by the Commission are too high.
