**Quarterly Report E.N.M.R. Telephone Cooperative, New Mexico RSA 4 East
Limited Partnership,
and Texas RSA 3 Limited Partnership
Regarding TTY Access to Digital Wireless Systems**

E.N.M.R. Telephone Cooperative, New Mexico RSA 4 East Limited Partnership, and Texas RSA 3 Limited Partnership ("the companies") hereby report on their implementation of text telephone ("TTY") access to digital wireless systems, in compliance with the Federal Communications Commission's ("FCC" or "Commission") Fourth Report and Order in the above-captioned proceeding.¹

Since the companies filed their last report on October 15, 2001, the companies have continued to follow-up with their network vendor, Nortel, regarding a digital TTY solution. The companies' digital TTY implementation efforts are dependent upon their switch manufacturer, Nortel, and the commercial availability of the Nortel TTY solution. Nortel has revised the estimated availability date of its software release, and now states that it will have a digital TTY solution available to the companies by March 2002 in software release MTX10. However, Nortel cautions that this is not a firm schedule. The companies have purchased software release MTX10 and will make the necessary changes to their processor/hardware when Nortel delivers and loads its product.

The companies remain committed to make every effort to implement digital TTY capability in their respective markets by the June 30, 2002 deadline. However, because the companies do not anticipate that they will meet the December 31, 2001 deadline established by the FCC's Fourth Report and Order for obtaining all software upgrades and equipment necessary to make their systems capable of transmitting 911 calls from TTY devices, the companies request a waiver of this requirement to the extent necessary.²
